Apprehending their arrest in connection with Jamhore P.S. Case No. 275 of 2025 instituted under Section 126(2), 115(2), 76, 303(2), 351(2), 352, 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, petitioners have moved before this court for grant of privileges of anticipatory bail. A copy of the anticipatory bail petition has been served upon the learned P.P.

The briefly stated prosecution story is that the accused persons armed with knife, lathi and pistol entered into the house of informant. On being protested, Ravi Singh @ Ravirajan had tried to outrage the modesty of the informant. The accused persons had beaten to the informant causing injuries over her chest and stomach. The accused persons scattered the other articles in her house. It is further alleged that Yaduvansh Singh had stolen jewellery and Rs. 50,000/- cash from the house of informant.

Learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that the petitioners are quite innocent and have been falsely implicated in this case. It is further submitted that petitioners' side were brutally assaulted by the prosecution party for which an F.I.R. vide Jamhore P.S. Case No. 272/2025 has been instituted. It has further been submitted by the learned counsel for the petitioners that the informant

had not sustained injury over her person. Petitioners are having no criminal antecedent. It is therefore prayed that the petitioners be released on anticipatory bail.

On the other hand, learned P.P. opposed the prayer for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and ld. P.P. for the State.

As per allegation, four accused persons entered into the house of informant and petitioner no. 1 had tried to molest the informant by holding her hair and the informant had sustained injury. They had also scattered the other articles in her house. It is alleged against the petitioner no. 2 that he had stolen a golden chain, a golden ring, mangalsutra, other ornaments and Rs. 50,000/- cash from her house. The court has perused the F.I.R. and the case diary. From perusal of the same it appears that there is an F.I.R. vide Jamhore P.S. Case No. 273/2025 lodged by the Arvind Singh against the husband of informant and her other family members and thereafter, the informant has lodged an F.I.R. against the petitioners vide Jamhore P.S. Case No. 275/2025. It is mentioned at para-41 of the case diary that petitioner no. 1 Ravi Ranjan Kumar, petitioner no. 2 Yaduvansh Singh and petitioner no. 3 Gudiya Devi are having no criminal antecedent.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners wants to withdraw the present anticipatory bail petition on behalf of petitioner no. 4 Arvind Singh. **Hence, there is no order passed regarding the petitioner no. 4 Arvid Singh.** So far as, other petitioners are concerned, it is hereby observed that the petitioners and the informant are co-villagers, there is case and counter case between the parties and petitioners are having clean antecedent. Hence, **the anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of three petitioners Ravi Ranjan Kumar, Yaduvansh Singh, Gudiya Devi is hereby allowed.** It is directed to release the petitioners on bail in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned court below within a period of four weeks from today on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount by each petitioners and to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down u/s 482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.
