Vikash Kumar & Anr. Vs. The State of Bihar

Bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioners (1) Vikash Kumar and (2) Aman Kumar, who are in judicial custody since 21.05.2025 in connection with Kasma P.S. Case No. 63 of 2025 instituted under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 109(2), 74, 303(2), 352, 351(2), 351(3), 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023. A copy of the bail petition has been served upon the Id. P.P. for the State.

Heard Sri Manoj Kumar Mishra, learned counsel appearing for the petitioners and Sri Pushkar Agrawal, learned P.P. for the State.

The brief facts of the case of the prosecution are that on 19.05.2025 the accused persons, who are brothers-in-law (devar) of the informant, assaulted her by means of danda causing injury on her shoulder, back and waist and snatched her mangalsutra.

Learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that petitioners are innocent and they have been falsely implicated in this case as they have not committed any offence as alleged in the prosecution story. Petitioners herein are the brothers-in-law (devar) of the informant and there is land dispute between them. Injury was found to be simple in nature. Petitioners are having no criminal antecedent. It is lastly submitted that petitioners are languishing in custody since 21.05.2025. It is therefore prayed that the petitioners be released on bail.

Per contra, learned P.P. opposed the prayer for grant of bail to the petitioners.

Perused the record as well as the case diary. The accusation against the petitioners is that they have assaulted the informant by means of danda and snatched her mangalsutra. However, the nature of injury was found to be simple in nature by the doctor. Petitioners herein are devar of the informant. Petitioners are having no criminal antecedent, as mentioned in paragraph-26 of the case diary and they are languishing in custody since 21.05.2025.

Considered the above facts and circumstances of the case, let the

petitioners, above named, be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down u/s 480(3) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.
