The instant Anticipatory Bail Petition has been filed by (1) Ankur Kumar Bhuiyan, S/O Jitendra Bhuiya @ Jitendra Manjhi, R/O village- Risiup, PS- Risiup, District- Aurangabad (Bihar) arising out of Risiup PS Case no. 122/2025 pending in the court of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Aurangabad under Section 137(2) and 96 of the BNS.

Sri Nakul Mehta, learned counsel on behalf of the petitioner stated that no bail petition has been filed either in the present Court or in the Hon'ble Patna High Court. Petitioner had clean antecedent and was falsely implicated in the present case because of the village politics. Hence, the learned Counsel prayed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

The learned A.P.P. vehemently opposed the anticipatory bail petition on the ground that the allegations imposed against the petitioner was serious in nature.

Heard both the sides and perused the case record.

On perusal of case record it is revealed that this case has been registered under Sections 137(2) and 96 of the BNS. The allegation against the petitioner is that he kidnapped the minor daughter of the informant by enticing her. According to the statement of the victim recorded under Section 183 of the BNSS she was in love with the petitioner and voluntarily eloped with him as her parents fixed her marriage with someone else. According to the certificate given by the school the date of birth of the girl was 01.01.2008 which indicate that she was 17 years and 9 months old on the date of the occurrence which is an illustration of border line age. Presently, the girl has attained majority and she very clearly stated that she was in romantic relationship with the petitioner. Considering the given facts, the present court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner on being arrested or his surrender before the learned Trial Court within two weeks from the date of receipt of copy of this order is entitled be released on Anticipatory bail on furnishing a bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of Chief Judicial

Magistrate, Aurangabad with conditions as laid down in Section 482 (2) of the BNSS. Accordingly, the anticipatory bail of the petitioner Ankur Kumar Bhuiyan is hereby **allowed**.
