Apprehending their arrest in connection with Goh P.S. Case No.46/2026 instituted under Sections 190, 191(2), 126(2), 115(2), 109, 117(2), 352 of Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, petitioners have moved before this court for grant of privileges of anticipatory bail. A copy of the anticipatory bail petition has been served upon the ld. P.P. for the State.

The brief facts of the prosecution is that on dated 06.02.2026 at about 02:00PM, all accused persons including the petitioners have assaulted to the informant. It is alleged that Ajit kumar has assaulted to the informant by iron rod in which he sustained leg injury. It is further alleged that Bifan Ram wrapped a gamcha around his neck and slammed him, then sat on his chest and started pulling the cloth from both sides with an intention to kill him.

It has been submitted by the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners that the petitioners are quite innocent and have committed no offence. They have been falsely implicated in this case. He further stated that there is a counter case vide Goh P.S case no. 47/2026. Petitioners are having no criminal antecedent. It is therefore prayed that the petitioners be enlarged on anticipatory

On the other hand, learned P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for grant of bail to the petitioner.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner, learned P.P. for the State.

From perusal of an FIR it is alleged that petitioner no.1 had caused injury over the leg of the informant by iron rod and thereafter, one Bifan Ram had tried to kill the informant by putting gamcha in his neck and thereafter, accused persons had started brick batting on Rohit Kumar, Gautam Kumar and Sumit Kumar. It is found on the record available before the court that there is a counter FIR lodged by the side of the petitioner vide Goh P.S case no. 47/2026 against the informant and his family members. On dated 21.02.2026, the court had earlier called for case diary and injury report but supplementary injury report has not been received till date. It is alleged against petitioner no.1 that he had caused leg injury to the informant. It is alleged against petitioner no.2 that he had tried to kill the informant by putting gamcha on the neck of the informant apart from that there is no specific allegation against all of them. It is also mentioned in the injury report that one person received injury over right parietal region of head of size 3 inch x 3 inch caused by hard and blunt object and other persons had received injuries over non-vital part of the body. It is mentioned at para 3 of the petition that petitioners are having no criminal antecedent.

Considering the fact that both parties are co-villagers and no any sharp-cutting weapon was used by the side of the petitioners and they had not inflicted any injury on the vital part of the body of the injured except the one who had received injury over his right parietal region of head. Hence, the anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of the above-named petitioners, is hereby allowed. It is directed to release the petitioners on bail in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned court below within a period of four weeks from today on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the

like amount each of petitioners subject to the satisfaction of the learned court below and the conditions as laid down u/s 482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023. However, it is observed that if the injury received by the injured over his right parietal of head, is found to be grievous then the prosecution is having liberty to move for cancellation of bail.
