Apprehending their arrest in connection with Haspura P.S. Case No.46/2026 instituted for the offence u/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 74, 303(2), 352, 3(5) of Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, petitioners have moved before this court for grant of privileges of anticipatory bail. A copy of the anticipatory bail petition has been served upon the ld. P.P. for the State.

The briefly stated prosecution story is that on 09.02.2026 at about 07:00PM, all the accused persons, in an intoxicated condition, abused and assaulted brother-in-law of the informant by which he sustained head injury. It is further alleged that accused persons have also assaulted to her sister in-law by which she sustained stomach injury. Accused persons have also tried to molest her daughter and stolen Rs.5000/- by broken the box.

It has been submitted by the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners that the petitioners are wholly innocent and have committed no offence. Petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case. He further stated that a counter case has also been registered vide Haspura P.S. Case No. 43/2026 against

the informant. Petitioner no.1 and 2 are having one criminal antecedent. It is therefore prayed that the petitioners be enlarged on anticipatory bail.

On the other hand, learned P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned P.P. for the State.

As per allegation, the petitioners have abused and beaten to the side of the informant by which younger brother in-law of the informant named as Roshan Kumar has sustained head injury and sister in law of the informant was beaten over her stomach and it is further alleged that petitioners/accused had tried to molest her daughter and also stolen Rs.5,000/-. From perusal of an FIR and the case diary, it appears that there is a counter FIR lodged by the petitioner No.2 vide Haspura P.S. case No. 43/2026 against the informant and her family members and thereafter, the informant has lodged the present FIR against the petitioners/accused. The court has perused the injury report and all injuries sustained by sides of the informant are found to be simple in nature. Para 25 of the case diary shows that petitioners are having clean antecedent.

Considering the aforesaid observation, the anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of the above-named petitioners, is hereby **allowed**. It is directed to release the petitioners on bail in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned court below within a period of four weeks from today on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount by each petitioners subject to the satisfaction of the learned court below and the conditions as laid down u/s 482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.
