Apprehending his arrest in connection with Rafiganj P.S. Case No.98/2025 instituted for the offence u/s 191(2), 191(3), 190, 74, 118, 126(2), 115(2), 109(1), 303(2), 117(2), 351(2) of Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, petitioner has moved before this court for grant of privileges of anticipatory bail. A copy of the anticipatory bail petition has been served upon the ld. P.P. for the State.

The briefly stated prosecution story is that all the accused persons including the petitioners had entered into the house of informant's brother-in-law four-five days ago and had tried to molest his daughter. When husband of the informant saw them and objected, then they threatened him that they will shoot her husband also. On 24.02.2025 at about 06:00 hours, all the accused persons including the petitioners along with 15 others had entered into the informant's house and beaten all women and children. It is alleged that accused persons have destroyed her bike and cooler which was kept in the house. The informant has taken a loan of Rs.2 Lakh from the group which was kept in a box and they have also taken the said money and jewellery and ran away. In that sequence, whoever came from the village, accused persons had also assaulted them and due to which head and hand injuries were caused to some persons. People also got injured.

It has been submitted by the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner that the petitioner is wholly innocent and has committed no offence. He has been falsely implicated in this case due to rural politics. He has further submitted that informant and her associates are committing a lot of wrong deeds and entire village is involved in the business of illicit liquor and are completely ruining the society. They are threatening to implicate in a false to others. Petitioner is an old person aged about 65 years. Petitioner is having no criminal antecedent. It is therefore prayed that the petitioners be enlarged on anticipatory bail.

On the other hand, learned P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned P.P. for the State.

It is alleged against seventeen accused persons that they have come to the house of the informant, beaten her and her family members and looted Rs.2Lakh cash and jewellery of Rs.50,000/-. From perusal of the document attached along with the present anticipatory bail petition, it appears that eight co-accused persons have been released on anticipatory bail vide ABP No.1874/2025 on dated 23.09.2025. From perusal of an FIR and the case diary it appears that there are general and omnibus allegations against the petitioner. Injuries were found to be simple in nature. The petitioners and informant are the resident of the same village. It is mentioned at para 3 of the petition that petitioner is having no criminal antecedent.

Considering the fact that similarly situated co-accused persons have been released on anticipatory bail, the petitioner and the informant are co-villagers, general and omnibus allegation against the petitioner and the petitioner is having clean antecedent. Hence, the anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of the above-named petitioner, is hereby allowed. It is directed to release the petitioner on bail in the event of his arrest or surrender before the learned court below within a
