The petitioner, who has been undergoing judicial custody since 16.01.2026, preferred this application for grant of regular bail in connection with Haspura P.S. Case No.22/2026 instituted for the offence u/s 318(4), 69, 351(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023. A copy of the bail petition has been served upon the Id. P.P. for the State

The brief facts of the prosecution is that the petitioner had been in a love relationship with the informant for about five years and establish physical relations with her on the pretext of marriage. On 14.01.2026, the petitioner called the informant over the phone and asked her to come to Birhara Bazar and insisted on establishing physical relations with her. When the informant refused, the petitioner tried to persuade and mislead her and put pressure on her to establish such relations. When the informant raised an alarm, nearby villagers gathered there. Thereafter, at Kali Asthan Temple, the petitioner applied vermilion on the forehead of the informant. However, the petitioner is now refusing to keep the informant as his wife.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is quite innocent. He further stated that petitioner is a B-Tech first year student and has falsely been implicated in this case due to conspiracy. It is lastly submitted that the petitioner has been languishing under judicial custody since 16.01.2026. It is

therefore prayed that the petitioner be released on bail.

On the other hand, learned P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for grant of bail to the petitioner.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned P.P. for the State.

It is an admitted fact that parties are having love affairs between them last five years. At para 4 and 5 of the case diary, there are statement of mother and father of the victim respectively and they also admitted that they are having knowledge regarding the lover affairs of the parties. There is an allegation against the petitioner that he had established physical relationship with the informant on the pretext of marriage. At para 24 of the case diary, it is mentioned that the petitioner is having no criminal antecedent. The Petitioner has been undergoing judicial custody since 16.01.2026.

Considering the fact that there was long-standing relationship between the parties, the parties are major and relationship between parties are within the knowledge of both sides. Petitioner has been undergoing judicial custody since 16.01.2026 and he is having clean antecedent. Hence, bail petition filed on behalf of the petitioner is hereby **allowed** subject to furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below.
