Apprehending his arrest in connection with Aurangabad (Muffasil) P.S. Case No. 274/2025 instituted for the offence u/s 126(2), 115(2), 352, 351(2), 109(1), 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, petitioner has moved before this court for grant of privileges of anticipatory bail. A copy of the bail petition has been served upon the ld. P.P. for the State.

The brief facts of the case of the prosecution are that on 21.07.2025 at 09:00 p.m. the named accused persons including the petitioner wrongfully detained the informant's husband namely Arjun Yadav and entered into altercation with him relating to land dispute. In the meantime, Upendra Yadav assaulted him with garasa causing injury on his head. When the informant's bhaisur Suresh Yadav came for his rescue, Sumit and Raushan Kumar assaulted him with khanti as a result of which Suresh Yadav sustained head injury.

It has been submitted by the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner that the petitioner is quite innocent and has committed no offence. He has been falsely implicated in this case. There is a land dispute going on between the parties. Petitioner is having clean antecedent. It is lastly submitted that co-accused persons have been released on anticipatory bail vide A.B.P. No. 1963/2025, 2150/2025 and 12/2026. On these grounds, it is prayed that the petitioners be given the privileges of anticipatory bail.

On the other hand, learned P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for grant of bail to the petitioner.

From perusal of an F.I.R., there is specific allegation against the petitioner that he had caused head injury to the informant's husband named as Arjun

Yadav by a garasa (sharp-cutting weapon). As per injury report, three lacerated wounds including lacerated wound over occipital area, were found over the person of the injured Arjun Yadav and the aforesaid injuries were found to be grievous in nature.

Considering the fact the petitioner had caused head injury to the injured Arjun Yadav, which was found to be grievous in nature. **Hence, the anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of the petitioner is hereby rejected.** It is directed to the petitioner to surrender before the court below and thereafter move his application for bail.
