The petitioners, who have been undergoing judicial custody since 25.02.2026, preferred this application for grant of regular bail in connection with Nabinagar P.S. Case No.186/2025 instituted for the offence u/s 115(2), 126(2), 109(1), 192, 191(2), 117(2), 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023. A copy of the bail petition has been served upon the ld. P.P. for the State.

The brief facts of the prosecution is that on 07.06.2025 at about 12:00 hours, near Nahar Colony, all the accused persons including the petitioners came and abused the informant. When the informant tried to escape from there, accused persons including the petitioners have assaulted the informant in which he sustained head and leg injury. It is also alleged that accused persons have snatched Rs.30,000/- from his pocket.

Learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that the petitioners are quite innocent. Petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case. There is no specific allegation against the petitioners. He further submitted that the informant met with a road accident and fell down on the left side of his body putting all body weight on left side. It is lastly submitted that the petitioners have been

languishing under judicial custody since 25.02.2026. It is therefore prayed that the petitioners be released on bail.

On the other hand, learned P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for grant of bail to the petitioners.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned P.P. for the State.

The present FIR has been lodged against five named accused persons including the petitioners, alleging that they assaulted the informant and snatched a sum of Rs.30,000/- from his pocket. From perusal of the injury report, it appears that the injury found in the CT scan report is simple in nature, whereas grievous injuries have been reported in the X-ray report with respect to the left arm, left shoulder, left leg and left forearm. There are general and omnibus allegations against the petitioners. It is further mentioned at paragraph 31 of the case diary that the petitioners are having no criminal antecedent. The petitioners have been undergoing judicial custody since 25.02.2026.

Considering the facts that there are general and omnibus allegations against the petitioners, petitioners are having clean antecedent, petitioners have been undergoing judicial custody last one month. Hence, bail petition filed on behalf of the petitioners is hereby **allowed** subject to furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below.

However, it is directed that the petitioners shall not involve themselves in any similar kind of offence against the informant or his family members.
