Apprehending his arrest in connection with Madanpur P.S. Case No.446/2025 instituted for the offence u/s 126(2), 115(2), 117(2), 109, 74, 303(2), 352, 3(5) of Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, petitioner has moved before this court for grant of privileges of anticipatory bail. A copy of the anticipatory bail petition has been served upon the Id. P.P. for the State.

The briefly stated prosecution story is that the named accused persons including the petitioner were constructing house over the land of the informant and on protest made by her, petitioner Rajesh Kumar and co-accused Ashok Thakur assaulted to one Gopal Thakur by means of lathi and iron rod respectively causing injury on his head and hand. Accused persons also assaulted other family members of the informant. Anju Devi and Urmila Devi snatched the jitiya and earring of the informant and Ankita Devi respectively. Petitioner has concern with the anti-social element of the society

It has been submitted by the learned counsel appearing for the petitioner that the petitioner is wholly innocent and has committed no offence. The present case is the counter blast to Madanpur P.S. Case No. 447/2025. All other sections are bailable in nature except Sections 109, 74 BNS. There is general

and omnibus allegation against the petitioner. Petitioner is having one antecedent vide Complaint Case No. 446/2023 and the same has been filed by the present informant. It is therefore prayed that the petitioners be enlarged on anticipatory bail.

On the other hand, learned P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned P.P. for the State.

As per contents of an FIR, it is alleged against the accused persons that they were making a construction of house over the disputed land. On intervention by the side of the informant, co-accused-Ashok Thakur and the petitioner had caused injury to the informant. It is specifically alleged against the petitioner that he had caused hand injury to the informant- Gopal Thakur by an iron rod. It is further alleged against the petitioner that he along with his father had tried to beat the informant by hand and fists and also tried to outrage her modesty. It is further alleged that all accused persons had caused head injury to Gopal Thakur. From perusal of the documents attached along with this anticipatory bail petition, it appears that co-accused persons have been granted anticipatory bail vide ABP No. 271/2026 and 482/2026. From perusal of the same, it appears that there was lacerated wound found over the head of Gopal Thakur and the same injury was found to be simple. Other two injuries were found one as lacerated wound on left elbow and another as swelling on left elbow. Opinion regarding other two injuries is kept reserved and the aforesaid injury was appears to be caused by hard and blunt substance.

Considering the fact that there was a land dispute going on between the parties, there is no specific allegations against the petitioner that he has caused injury over the vital part of the body and other co-accused persons have already been released on anticipatory bail. Apart from the fact that there is a case and counter case between the parties, hence the anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf
