Apprehending their arrest in connection with Jamhore P.S. Case No.01/2026 instituted for the offence u/s 303(2), 352, 3(5) of Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, petitioners have moved before this court for grant of privileges of anticipatory bail. A copy of the anticipatory bail petition has been served upon the Id. P.P. for the State.

The briefly stated prosecution story is that the petitioner is residing in Prayagraj, while the informant's parental home (mayaka) is situated at Village Ketiya. The informant frequently visits her parental home, where her jewellery, Apple mobile phone, laptop, and other belongings were kept. On dated 31.12.2025, when the informant went to her parental home, her mother did not allow her to enter the house. Thereafter, on 01.01.2026 at about 12:40 PM, the informant made a call to 112, and with their assistance she entered the house. Upon entering, she found that the lock of almirah was open and her bag was missing. The accused persons frequently visit the said house, and it is alleged that they have stolen the informant's belongings.

It has been submitted by the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners that the petitioners are wholly innocent and have committed no offence. He further stated that Petitioner-Rammani Devi is a 62-year-old widow and is the mother of the informant. Petitioners Archana Kumari and Kusum Kumari are the informant's sisters-in-law. Petitioners Saurabh Kumar Singh and Shailesh Kumar Singh are the own brothers of the informant, and Surendra Singh is the informant's cousin brother. He further stated that on 02.10.2025, the informant came to the petitioner's house along with a villager, Manoj Yadav, and demanded a share in the house and land. It is alleged that the informant assaulted petitioner Rajmani Devi and left the house after taking away, jewellery. In this regard, an FIR being Jamhore P.S. Case No. 233/2025 has been lodged. Petitioners are having no criminal antecedent. It is therefore prayed that the petitioners be enlarged on anticipatory bail.

On the other hand, learned P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned P.P. for the State.

The present FIR is lodged against the mother, her two brothers, one cousin and two sisters-in-law to the effect that the informant was residing at Prayagraj and when she came to her parental home, she found that her jewellery, mobile and clothes are missing. It is further alleged that on dated 31.12.2025 when she tried to enter into the house, her mother did not allow her and on dated 01.01.2026 she called on Dail 112 and thereafter, she found that the aforesaid things were missing. It is very surprising and shocking on the part of the court that an FIR lodged by the informant against her mother due to obstruction made from her side to enter into her house. The present FIR has been lodged under section 303(2), 352, 3(5) of BNS, 2023.

Considering the fact that informant and petitioners are family members and there is no serious dispute between them and petitioners are having clean antecedents as mentioned at para 3 of the anticipatory bail petition, hence, the anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of the above-named petitioners, is hereby allowed. It is directed to release the petitioners on bail in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned court below within a period of four weeks from today on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount subject to the satisfaction of the learned court below and the conditions as laid down u/s 482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.
