Apprehending their arrest in connection with Madanpur P.S. Case No.68/2026 instituted under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 117(2), 109, 352, 351(3), 3(5) of Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, petitioners have moved before this court for grant of privileges of anticipatory bail. A copy of the anticipatory bail petition has been served upon the ld. P.P. for the State.

The brief facts of the prosecution is that on dated 14.02.2026, the informant and his friend Bhola Singh was returning from library then all accused persons including the petitioners have assaulted to him and his friend in which he sustained head injury. It is further alleged that accused persons along with five-six unknown persons have come to the house of informant, abused, and threatened to kill him.

It has been submitted by the learned counsel appearing for the petitioners that the petitioners are quite innocent and have committed no offence. They have been falsely implicated in this case. He further stated that there is a counter case vide Madanpur P.S case no. 69/2026 lodged by the side of petitioner. Petitioner No.1 Manish Kumar is having one criminal antecedent vide Madanpur P.S case no. 79/2022 and petitioner No.2 Omprakash is having no criminal antecedent.

It is therefore prayed that the petitioners be enlarged on anticipatory bail.

On the other hand, learned P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for grant of bail to the petitioner.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner, learned P.P. for the State.

From perusal of record it appears that the petitioners and the informant are co-villagers. There are general and omnibus allegation against the petitioners. So far as criminal antecedent of the petitioners are concerned, it is mentioned that petitioner no.1 is having one criminal antecedent vide Madanpur P. S Case no. 79/22 which was lodged at the time when the petitioner was juvenile and the petitioner no.2 is having no criminal antecedent. Injuries were found to be simple in nature. There is a counter FIR vide Madanpur P.S case no. 69/2026 lodged by the side of the petitioner.

Considering the aforesaid observations, the anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of the above-named petitioners, is hereby allowed. It is directed to release the petitioners on bail in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned court below within a period of four weeks from today on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount of each petitioners subject to the satisfaction of the learned court below and the conditions as laid down u/s 482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.
