**ORDER DATED 04.04.2026**

The instant Bail Petition has been filed by (1) Sagar Singh, Age- 25 years, S/O Ram Singh, R/o- village- Dhanupura, P.S.- Kadar Chowk, District- Badayu (Uttar Pradesh) arising out of Obra P.S. Case No. 270/2025 pending in the court of SDJM, Daudnagar under Sections 305(a), 331(6), 62 of the BNS and S. 27 of the Arms Act. The petitioner is in custody since 26.02.2026.

Sri Anil Kumar, the learned counsel on behalf of the petitioner stated that earlier no bail petition was filed before the present Court and the Hon'be High Court, Patna. Petitioner had criminal antecedent in Mali PS case no. 153/2025, 154/2025 and 162/2025. The petitioner was innocent and had falsely been implicated in the present case only on the basis of suspicion by the police. In light of given facts, the learned Counsel prayed to grant bail to the petitioner.

The learned A.P.P. Sri Bindeshwari Prasad Tanti vehemently opposed the bail petition on the ground that the allegation imposed against the petitioner was serious in nature.

Heard and perused the case record.

On perusal of case record it is revealed that present case has been registered under Sections 305(a), 331(6), 62 of the BNS and S. 27 of the Arms Act. The allegation on the petitioner is that he along with other persons entered the jewelry and utensils shop of the informant by cutting the shutter but left the shop by firing in air when the alarm was raised by the informant. Nothing was stolen from his shop. Perusal of the case record reveals that FIR has been registered against un-known and the name of the petitioner surfaced on the basis of his confessional statement given by him in some other case. The statement of the witnesses of the case diary clearly depict that there was an attempt of theft while nothing was stolen from his shop coupled with the fact that accused is in custody since 26.02.2026 and his name cropped up only on the basis of his confessional statement. Taking into consideration the above mentioned facts, the Court is inclined to grant regular bail to the petitioner on furnishing a bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of SDJM, Daudnagar. Accordingly the regular bail petition of the petitioner Sagar Singh is hereby **allowed.**
