Apprehending their arrest in connection with Tandwa P.S. Case No.81/2026 instituted for the offence u/s 115(2), 117(2), 126(2), 109(1), 74, 76, 303(2), 351(1), 351(2), 352, 3(5) of Bhartiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, petitioners have moved before this court for grant of privileges of anticipatory bail. A copy of the anticipatory bail petition has been served upon the ld. P.P. for the State.

The prosecution case in brief is that on dated 01.06.2026 at about 09:00 am all the accused persons including the petitioners had assaulted to the informant. It is alleged that Sarfaraj Ansari, Salman Ansari, Jasmuddin Ansari and Samir Ansari had assaulted the informant by iron rod in which he sustained head injury. It is further alleged that when Sahidan Khatoon had come to rescue the informant, then, Shahnaj Khatoon and Salman Ansari had assaulted her by iron rod in which she sustained head injury. It is further alleged that Sarfaraj Ansari had misbehaved with the mother of informant and had torn her clothes and snatched her earrings.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that petitioners are quite innocent and have been falsely implicated in this case. It is further submitted that there is a counter case vide Tandwa P.S case no.82/2026 lodged against the informant and his persons. Petitioner No.1 and 2 are having one criminal antecedents and petitioner no.3 is having no criminal antecedent. It is therefore

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prayed that the petitioners be enlarged on anticipatory bail.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioners are ready to voluntarily deposit Rs.1000/- (Rupees One Thousand) each in the office of Nazarat, Aurangabad for the purpose of well-being of children residing at Vrihad Ashray Grih Balgrih Unit-I, Babhandi, Aurangabad, Bihar.

On the other hand, learned P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned P.P. for the State.

It is alleged that the petitioners had caused injury to the informant, his mother and further outraged the modesty and snatched an earrings. Informant had earlier lodged two cases against the petitioners. The informant had earlier lodged two cases against the petitioners. So far as injuries details are concerned, injury is found to be simple in nature. There is a counter FIR vide Tandwa P.S case no.82/2026. It is mentioned at para 3 of the anticipatory bail petition that petitioner no.1 and Petitioner No. 2 are having one criminal antecedent and petitioner no.3 is having clean antecedent.

Considering the aforesaid observations, the anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of the petitioners, is hereby **allowed**. It is directed to release the petitioners on bail in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned court below within a period of four weeks from today on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount by each subject to the satisfaction of the learned court below and the conditions as laid down u/s 482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023.

Since the petitioners are ready to voluntarily deposit Rs.1000/- (Rupees One Thousand) each **in the office of Nazarat, Aurangabad** for the purpose of well-being of children residing at Vrihad Ashray Grih Balgrih Unit-I, Babhandi, Aurangabad, Bihar. Hence, the petitioners are permitted to deposit the same.
