ORDER DATED 06.08.2026

The instant Anticipatory Bail Petition has been filed by (1) Arvind Kumar Nanda, Age- 54 years, S/o- Late Ganga Pandit, R/o- Digha road, Shiv Sambhu Nagar near BV college, Patna, PS- Patna, District- Patna (Bihar) arising out of Daudnagar PS Case no. 126/2026 pending in the court SDJM, Daudnagar under Section 318(2), 319(2), 271, 272 and Section 4, 18 and 23 of the PCPNDT Act.

Smt. Nagendra Singh- I, the learned Counsel for petitioner has stated that no other bail petition was pending either in this court or any Superior Court and the petitioner had clean antecedent. The petitioner was an old man of 53 years and had no concern with the Ashok Ultrasound Centre and with its staff. At present, petitioner is posted as Medical Officer at Jehanabad Sadar Hospital and the petitioner was also suffering from several ailments for which document has been annexed with the present anticipatory bail petition. In light of given facts, the learned counsel prayed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

The learned A.P.P. Sri Bindeshwari Prasad Tanti vehemently opposed the anticipatory bail petition on the ground that the allegations imposed against the petitioner was serious in nature.

Heard both the sides and perused the case record.

Perusal of the case record reveals that FIR has been lodged under Section 318(2), 319(2), 271, 272 and Section 4, 18 and 23 of the PCPNDT Act. The prosecution story is short is that the petitioner Dr. Anmol Kumar, Medical Officer PHC, Daudnagar along with other authorities raided the Alok Ultrasound Clinic run by one Alok Kumar Ranjan, to ascertain whether the mentioned clinic was not running illegally to determine the sex of the foetus and conducting foeticide. On seeing the raiding party the shutter of the clinic was pulled down and locked by the said Alok Kumar Ranjan. After efforts the shutter was finally opened. To obstruct the enquiry, Alok Kumar Ranjan shifted few women to another building. On enquiry the Ultrasound machine was found to be running, the probe had gel on it and few Ultrasound reports were being printed. No female assistant was found on the spot. Perusal of the clinic registered depicted that Ultrasound of 13 people was done and per person Rs.-900/- was being charged for the same. Alok Kumar Ranjan informed that he had no degree of a MBBS Doctor nor he was a Radiologist. He further informed that he had applied for registration of the clinic in the name of co-accused Rahul Kumar and failed to

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furnish any relevant document in support of running the clinic. Perusal of the case diary reveals that petitioner who was Medical Officer at Sadar Hospital, Jehanabad was the proprietor of the mentioned Ultrasound clinic who had degree of Radiology and was a qualified MBBS doctor. However, para 3, and 4 of the case diary clearly indicate that the Ultrasound was not being done by the petitioner but by co-accused who were not a qualified doctors. Further, Para 5 and 6 of the case diary signify that the clinic was not yet registered. The above conduct of both the petitioner depicts that the petitioner although being a qualified medical practitioner was allowing to conduct Ultrasound in an unregistered clinic of which he was proprietor by persons who had no medical degree which clearly indicate that the act of petitioner was dangerous for the lives of the patients who visited there for Ultrasound. Hence, the Court is to the conclusion that the petitioner does not deserve the privilege of the Anticipatory Bail. Accordingly, the Anticipatory Bail Petition of the petitioner Arvind Kumar Nanda is hereby **rejected**.
