ORDER DATED 17.03.2026

The instant Anticipatory Bail Petition has been filed by (1) Devanti Devi, W/O Basudeo Ravidas, Age-42 years, R/O village- pipra, PS- Muffasil, District- Aurangabad (Bihar) arising out of Muffasil PS Case no. 463/2025 pending in the court of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Aurangabad under Section 126(2), 115(2), 352, 74, 303(2), 3(5) of the BNS.

Sri Ashok Prasad Sinha, learned counsel on behalf of the petitioner stated that no bail petition has been filed either in the present Court or in the Hon'ble Patna High Court. Petitioner had criminal antecedents in Muffasil PS Case no. 154/2022, 140/2018 and 248/2022. The petitioner had falsely been implicated in the present case due to village politics and the allegation of snatching ornaments and outraging of modesty is made to make the case non-bailable. Hence, the learned Counsel prayed to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

The learned A.P.P. vehemently opposed the anticipatory bail petition on the ground that the allegations imposed against the petitioner was serious in nature.

Heard both the sides and perused the case record.

On perusal of case record it is revealed that this case has been registered under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 352, 74, 303(2), 3(5) of the BNS. The allegation against the petitioner is that she along with her husband assaulted the informant and her son. Thereafter, the petitioner snatched the gold mangalsutra and earrings of the informant. The witnesses in their statements recorded under Section 180 of the BNSS in the case diary have not specified the weapons used to assault the injured and the allegations imposed upon the petitioner of hitting is general. Further, the injury report is not on record and according to para-19, 26 and 33 of the case diary the injury report was not furnished by the concerned hospital despite several demands by the investigating officer. Hence, the nature and seriousness of injury could not be ascertained in absence of the injury report. In light of the given facts, the court is to the conclusion that the petitioner deserves the privilege of anticipatory bail on furnishing a bail bond

of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Aurangabad with conditions as laid down in Section 482 (2) of the BNSS. Accordingly, the anticipatory bail petition of the petitioner Devanti Devi is hereby **allowed**.

Office is directed to send a letter to Civil Surgeon, Aurangabad to take appropriate action against the concerned Medical Officer who did not furnish the injury report despite several demands and inform the Court within a week of receiving of the present order.
