ORDER

- 1. Yearning for an order of emancipation the bail petition has been filed by the petitioner, who is booked in Banka(Odhani dam) Police Station Case No. 556 of 2025, for the offence allegedly committed under Sections 191(2), 191(3), 190, 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 117(2), 352, 351(2), 109 of BNS and is confined in jail since 28.01.2026.*
- 2. The case of prosecution is based upon a gravamen filed by one Nityanand Singh with the allegations that on 08.12.2025, at about 02:00 pm, (i). Sanjay Yadav, (ii). Pankaj Yadav, (iii). Prashuram Yadav, (iv). Rishi Yadav, (v). Guddu Yadav, (vi). Yogendra Marik, (vii). Mohan Khaira were working with JCB on his land. When the informant along with his brother and son etc. went to stop them, they stated that they have to purchase this land. The next day i.e. 09.12.2025, at about 11:00 pm, Mohan Khaira and Chouni Ray fixed to convene a Panchayat, on that day they were ready with documents of the land, all of sudden Sanjay Yadav having Khanti, Panjay Yadav having axe, Parshuram Yadav having Gadasa, Rishi Yadav having axe, Guddu Yadav having iron rod, Yogendra Yadav having axe, Mohan Khaira having Pasiyani came there and attacked them and started beating them. They were blood wet and fell on the ground.*
- 3. In oral arguments, the learned counsel for petitioner submitted that the petitioner has no criminal antecedent. There is no specific allegation as to who assaulted upon him. It is stated that the accused petitioner is confined in jail since 28.01.2026, for no offence.*
- 4. In counter, learned Public Prosecutor for the State stoutly opposed the bail*

application with the submissions that the accused person armed with deadly weapons with them by hatching conspiracy attacked the victim party and then again to convene a Panchayat called the victims and attacked them.

5. *Heard rival submissions and perused the record. The injury report of Sadanand Singh shows that he sustained lacerated wound of size 5x1x1/2 CM of parietal region of skull left side. NCCT brain of multiple skull fractures involving left temporal and frontal bones with associated Hemosinus. The injury has been reported grievous in nature. Then the injury report of Ranjit Kumar Singh, shows that he sustained left parietal bone fractures extending to squamous temporal bone with associated scalp hematoma, this injure is also opined grievous. The injury report of Sujit Kumar Singh has been reported that lacerated wound over occipital region. Injury is simple in nature. Likewise there are injure reports of Nityanand Singh and Gulshan Kumar Singh. In the opinion of this court, in this case there are multiple injuries over the vital parts of victims and that the case is still at nascent stage of investigation as no charge-sheet has been filed; therefore, this court is not inclined to grant bail; resultantly it is dismissed.*

6. *File be consigned to the record room and that of trial court be sent back with a copy of this order.*

7. *Keeping in view the General Order no. 1 of 1991 (Criminal) dated 07.03.1991, the certified copy of FIR, if desired, be returned back to the petitioner on placing the xerox copy thereof on record.*
