ORDER

- 1. Yearning for an order of emancipation the petition has been filed by the petitioner, who is booked in Dhoraiya Police Station Case No. 270 of 2025, for the offence allegedly committed under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 109, 352, 351(2), 3/5 of BNS and is confined in jail since 31.01.2026.*
- 2. The case of prosecution is based upon an application filed by one Anil Yadav, with the allegations that on 29.09.2025, at about 06:30 pm, while he was coming to his home, on the way, (i) Santosh Singh, (ii) Anil Singh, (iii). Surendra Singh, were in blotto they intercepted his vehicle and started abusing him. When he refused to do so, they all allegedly attacked him with blackjack, sticks etc. When his daughter Komal Kumari and his nephew Nitish Kumar came to rescue, they were also assaulted. Santosh Singh gave a blow of iron rod on his head, resultantly blood started oozing and he fell on the earth. Anil Singh beaten his daughter and nephew.*
- 3. Learned counsel for the petitioner in his oral arguments submitted that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case. It is further submitted that the petitioner is confined in jail since 31.01.2026.*

4. In counter, learned public prosecutor stoutly opposed the bail application and the drew attention of the court para no. 19 of the case diary, according to which Anil Yadav sustained lacerated wound on his head. Likewise, Komal Kumari is also injured. Learned public prosecutor further submitted that there are direct allegations of assault against Santosh Singh of assaulting in the head of informant. The informant has sustained injury on his head i.e. the vital part of the body.

5. Heard rival submissions and perused the record. In this case there is direct allegation of assaulting and giving blow on the head of informant against the present petitioner. The case is still at its nascent stage of investigation as chargesheet has yet not been filed, therefore, the bail application is dismissed.

6. File be consigned to the record room and that of trial court be sent back with a copy of this order.

7. Keeping in view the General Order no. 1 of 1991 (Criminal) dated 07.03.1991, the certified copy of FIR, if desired, be returned back to the petitioner on placing the xerox copy thereof on record.
