1. An anticipatory bail petition dated 21.05.2026 has been filed on behalf of accused/petitioners namely; 1. **Priti Kumari** d/o-Dilip Kumar Ram and 2. **Indu Devi** w/o-Dilip Kumar Ram both R/o-Salempur Titu, Ward No.-10, P.S-Teghra, Dist.-Begusarai who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Teghra P.S Case No.187/2026 for committing an offence u/s-126(2), 115(2), 118(2), 352, 109, 3(5) of BNS.

2. The prosecution case in brief is that on 19.04.2026, the informant Nitesh Kumar was called home by his mother. Upon reaching home, he found his cousin sister Priti Kumari(petitioner) was abusing him. When he questioned why she was abusing, she started abusing more. Thereafter, the informant went to the market to buy vegetables. He informed his brother-in-law Chandan Kumar about the incident. His brother-in-law suggested they should talk to the father of Priti namely, Dilip Rai. They went back home. When they asked Dilip Kumar Rai why his daughter was abusing, then Dilip Kumar Rai attacked Chandan Kumar with a knife and stabbed in his stomach, causing him to collapse due to excessive bleeding. In the meantime, cousin sister Priti Kumari (petitioner) and her mother Indu Devi (petitioner) both joined in and started assaulting them. During the assault, Dilip Kumar Rai struck the informant Nitesh Kumar with the knife on his chest, right side of the neck, and right arm. The informant fell down drenched in blood. Thereafter, family members picked them up and took them to the Sub-Divisional Hospital, Teghra for treatment. So this case.

3. The Ld. Counsel appearing on behalf of accused/petitioners submitted that no any B.A or ABA has been filed before this Court or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. It is further submitted that the petitioners are innocent, have committed no offence, and they have been falsely implicated in this case. There is no criminal antecedent of the petitioners. There is land dispute between both the parties. He further submitted that petitioners are ready to abide all the conditions imposed by the court, so petitioners may be released on bail.

4. On the other hand, the Addl Spl. PP for State as well as learned counsel for the informant has vehemently opposed the prayer for bail to the petitioners.

5. Having heard both the parties and perused the case record along with case diary. On perusal of record, it appears that petitioners are named accused in FIR and there is allegation against the petitioners that they along with other co-accused persons have abused the informant, and thereafter, both petitioners Priti Kumari

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and Indu Devi actively participated in the assault. The informant has specifically stated that both the petitioners "came running and started assaulting" during the occurrence. Moreover, the witnesses at para 9, 10 and 11 have supported the case of prosecution. The occurrence involves assault with a sharp weapon. On perusal of injury report of the injured persons it appears that three stab wounds- (1). Stab wound over right side of neck of size 1cmx0.5cmx1.5cm, (2) Stab wound over anterior surface of chest of size 2cmx0.5cmx2.5cm, which is opined as grievous in nature and (3) Stab wound with deltoid muscle avulsion over right shoulder of size 8cmx4cmx3.5cm. The injuries were caused by a sharp weapon. The victim was referred to Sadar Hospital, Begusarai for HRCT Lung, Chest X-ray, Right Shoulder X-ray, and Cervical Spine X-ray. Particularly on vital parts like neck and chest, indicates the seriousness of the offence. There is land dispute between both the parties. The petitioners are named accused in registered offence u/ss-126(2), 115(2), 118(2), 352, 109, 3(5) of BNS. The investigation is still pending.

6. Considering the seriousness and nature of the allegations, the injuries sustained by the injured persons; I do not find it appropriate to grant the privilege of anticipatory bail to the petitioners. Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioners namely, Priti Kumari and Indu Devi is hereby **rejected**.
