23-05-2026	1. This anticipatory bail application has been filed on behalf of accused-petitioner Abhishek Anand, under Section 482 BNSS, seeking pre-arrest bail in connection with Kotwali P.S. Case No. 100/2025, instituted for the offences under Sections 316(2), 318(4), 61(2) of BNS. 2. Attendance and a Vakalatnama has been filed on behalf of informant Anirudh Prasad Singh. 3. Heard Sri Krishna Dev Mahto, learned counsel for the petitioner, Sri Sunil Kumar, learned counsel for the informant and Sri Satya Narayan Prasad Sah, learned Public Prosecutor for the State. 4. As per FIR the allegation against the petitioner is that he along with co-accused Rahul Kumar Jha, dealing assistant of the Bank, after committing fraud transferred total Rs. 28,05,000/- from the account of informant to the account of petitioner. 5. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence. He has falsely been implicated in this case. Entire allegation against the petitioner is false and concocted. He further submits that admittedly the petitioner happens to be the grand-son of the informant and due to some mis-understanding, the informant lodged the present case dragging the petitioner in this case. He further submits that due to intervention of well-wishers, the matter has amicably been settled between the parties and joint compromise petition alongwith permission petition has been filed before the learned court below and photo-copy of certified copy of said joint compromise and permission petition are attached with this bail application. The informant is present before the Court to support the factum of compromise between the parties. The petitioner bears clean antecedent. 6. The learned Public Prosecutor ably assisted by the learned counsel for the informant submitted that the informant has compromised the case with the

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petitioner and now there is no grievance of informant against the petitioner.

7. At the time of hearing, the informant was present before the court and on being asked by the Court he clearly stated that now cordial relation has been developed between them and he has got no objection, if the petitioner has been granted by this court.
8. Considering the submissions, the aforesaid facts & circumstances of the case, as discussed above and keeping in view that good relation has been restored between the parties and the informant has got no objection on the grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner, the anticipatory bail application of petitioner is allowed. It is ordered that in the event of arrest or surrender before the learned court below within four weeks from the date of this order, the petitioner Abhishek Anand shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 15,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down u/s 482 (2) of B.N.S.S.
