06-06-2026	The accused-petitioner Chamru Yadav who is in custody since 16-02-2026 has filed this bail petition in connection with Bakharpur P.S. Case No. 40/25 registered under Sections 103(1), 238, 3(5) BNS. On behalf of the petitioner a certificate has been given in para 2 of the bail petition that petitioner had not filed any bail petition in any form either in the court of learned Sessions Judge, Bhagalpur or before the Hon'ble High Court Patna. Further the petitioner bears one criminal antecedent as per para 3 of the bail petition. Prosecution case, as per FIR the written application of the informant in brief is that during patrolling on 13-06-2025 at about 10:00 AM he received information that a dead body of lady was found floating in the Ganga river under jurisdiction of Bhagwanipur OP, Katihar who was the wife of Bhikhari Singh resident of Bakharpur east under jurisdiction of Bakharpur Police Station. He reached the house of Bhikhari Singh for verification where he came to know that Bhikhari Singh has killed his wife in the evening of 11-06-2025 and Bhikhari Singh with the help of Banti Singh, Dharamraj Singh, Rajesh Yadav @ Langra and two unknown persons had thrown the dead body in the Ganga river with intention to hide the dead body and in the course of throwing the dead body in the Ganga River, accused Banti Singh also drowned in the river and died. The learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is not named in FIR rather his name has come on the basis of confessional statement. He further submitted that there is no any eye witness to the incident The petitioner is in custody since 16-02-2026. On such basis, it has been prayed that the petitioner be enlarged on bail. On the other hand, learned Additional P.P. for the State duly opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioner. Heard both sides and perused the case diary and case record. Perused the case diary and case record. Allegation against the petitioner is that he along with other co-accused persons were involved in concealing the dead body of wife	

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06-06-2026 Contd.P/2	of co-accused Bhikhari Singh. From the perusal of record it appears that petitioner is not named in FIR but his name has been surfaced during the course of investigation on the basis of the confessional statement of co-accused Rajesh Yadav @ Langda and Lal Bihari Yadav. Para-6 of the case diary is the re-statement of informant who reiterated the prosecution case. Para-18 and 26 of the case diary are the statement of witnesses who have supported the prosecution case. The Postmortem report of deceased reveals that one ligature mark 0.5” wide was present over neck completely encircling the neck, Legs were found not tied in contrast to police inquest, one ligature mark 0.5” wide was present over neck completely encircling the neck, on dissection, muscles and tissues of neck beneath the ligature mark were grossly contused and infiltrated with blood and blood clots, mucosa of larynx and trachea were deeply congested, thyroid cartilage was found fractured, solid organs like liver, spleen, kidneys and lungs were congested, both side of heart contained blood, stomach was empty, bladder was empty, brain and its meninges were liquefied, Uterus was small in size. Opinion the above noted injuries were antemortem and grievous in nature and caused by pressure and compression of neck by a ligature material consistent with ligature strangulation. The death was due to asphyxia and venous congestion due to antemortem ligature strangulation. Ligature material (orange color plastic rope) was handed over to concerned chowkidar under sealed cover of the department for needful. From perusal of record it also appears that final form has been submitted against the petitioner U/s 103(1), 238, 3(5) BNS. Petitioner also bears criminal antecedent. Moreover, bail petition of other co-accused persons have already been rejected by the then predecessor of this court. In the above facts and circumstances, allegation leveled against petitioner is serious in nature, this court is of the opinion that at this stage the applicant/petitioner is not entitled to grant of bail.
