Learned counsel for petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent, have committed no offence and have been falsely implicated in this case. There is no specific allegation of assault against the petitioners. The case has been compromised between the parties and injury sustained by the injured persons are simple in nature. The petitioners are man of clean antecedent and they undertake to comply with any condition as imposed by this court, hence, bail petition of the petitioners may be allowed.</p> <p>5. On the contrary learned P.P. opposed the bail petition of petitioners and submitted that petitioners mercilessly beaten informant and his brother, hence, bail petition of the petitioners may be dismissed.</p> <p>6. The petitioners and informant are co-villagers and petitioner Namee Paswan is senior citizen aged about 63 years. The petitioners and informant have settled their dispute amicably. The petitioners are man of clean antecedent and they undertake to comply with any conditions as imposed by this court.</p> <p>7. Considering the fact that informant and petitioners have settled their dispute amicably, there is no specific allegation of any overt or covert act has been assigned, clean antecedent of the petitioners, bail of the petitioners 1. Chhathu Paswan 2. Nihora Paswan and 3. Namee Paswan is allowed and it is ordered that in the event of arrest/surrender they shall be enlarged on anticipatory bail on furnishing bail-bonds of Rs.10,000/-(Ten thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below within four weeks of this order subject to the conditions as laid down u/s 482(2) BNSS.
