	<b><u>10-03-2026</u></b>	<p>The present petition for anticipatory bail has been filed on behalf of accused/ petitioners namely 1. Bhikhari Singh 2. Dipak Singh apprehending their arrest in connection with the present case.</p> <p>The case of the prosecution, in brief is that the informant Naveen Kumar gave a written application to the officer in-charge of Aayar Police Station stating therein that on 20.02.2025 on the basis of secret information regarding electricity theft, he conducted raid and found Bhikhari Singh was involved in electricity theft as he was using electricity illegally by joining new wire in the main wire. The electricity theft by Bhikhari Singh caused loss of revenue of Rs.1,19,526/- to the South Bihar Power Distribution Company Ltd. The petitioner Dipak Singh was also involved in electricity theft as he was using electricity illegally by joining new wire in the main wire. The electricity theft by Dipak Singh caused loss of revenue of Rs.58,090/- to the South Bihar Power Distribution Company Ltd.</p> <p>Learned counsel for petitioners submitted that that the petitioners are innocent and have committed no offence. Petitioners have falsely implicated in this case. The petitioners are ready to pay the fine and dues of the electricity department in easy installments. The petitioners are very poor family members.</p> <p>Sh. Vimlesh Kumar Shrivastaw, Ld. Panel Advocate for Electricity has opposed the prayer of anticipatory bail.</p> <p>Arguments heard and record perused.</p> <p>From the perusal of the record, it transpires that the allegations against the petitioners are that above noted case has been registered u/s 135 of Electricity Act. The petitioners are willing to pay the outstanding amount in installments.</p> <p>Considering the nature of offence and admission on behalf of the petitioners, I hereby direct petitioner no.1 Bhikhari Singh to pay outstanding amount within seven months in seven installments and petitioner no.2 Dipak Singh to pay outstanding amount within four months in four installments. The petitioners are granted anticipatory bail in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned court below within 20 days from today upon furnishing bail bonds to the tune of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each subject to the satisfaction of court concerned.
