	<u>16-03-2026</u>	<p>The present petition has been filed on behalf of accused/ petitioner namely Kalawati Kunwar apprehending her arrest in connection with the present case.</p> <p>The prosecution case in brief is that informant Usha Devi gave written application to the Officer-In-Charge of Mahila P.S Ara, Bhojpur stating that she was married to Sajjan Singh in the year 2014 as per Hindu Rites and Customs. Out of this bed-lock, she gave birth to a son Yash Kumar and daughter Sikha Kumari. Her father had gifted Rs. 5 Lakhs cash, clothes and furnitures worth Rs. 1.5 - 2 lakhs. Her husband Sajjan Singh, mother-in-law Kalawati Kunwar, gotani Devanti Kunwar and Puja Kunwar started harassing and torturing her mentally and physically for a gold chain and a motorcycle in dowry. In the mean-time, she saw her gotani Devanti Kunwar with her husband in objectionable condition in night and when she opposed all the persons assaulted her badly. Some neighbors informed her sister, then her sister and her brother-in-law came and took her to doctor where she given treatment. Thereafter she returned to her matrimonial house and informed her parents in this regard. She also gave written application in Mahila P.S. Her husband and in-laws came and after written compromise took her to her matrimonial house. Thereafter, on 24-07-2025 at 9.00 a.m. her in-laws and her husband badly assaulted her and snatched her costly articles and expelled out from her matrimonial house.</p> <p>Learned counsel for petitioner submitted that petitioner is innocent person and has committed no offence. The petitioner is old lady aged about 65 years and she is suffering from gout and stomach disease. There is no specific allegation against the petitioner. The allegations leveled against her areailable except 85 of B.N.S which is not applicable on the petitioner. The petitioner is ready to keep her daughter-in-law Usha Devi with her house. The gotani of informant most Devanti Devi lodged a case against the informant of this case vide Surajpura P.S. Case No. 107/2025 dated 10-04-2025 under sections 126(2),115(2),352,351(2) and 109,3(5) of B.N.S. The petitioner has no concern with the alleged offences. The petitioner has no any criminal antecedent. The petitioner is ward parshad and present case was instituted with intention to humiliate her.</p>

	<p><u>Conti.....</u> 16-03-2026</p>	<p>Learned Additional Public Prosecutor has opposed the prayer of anticipatory bail.</p> <p>Arguments heard and record perused.</p> <p>From the perusal of the record, it transpires that the allegations against the petitioner are that she along with co-accused used to harass and torture the informant in connection with demands of dowry. She also assaulted the informant and expelled out from her matrimonial house after taking her costly articles. The witnesses have supported the prosecution case in para no. 2,7,8,9 of case diary. The petitioner is mother-in-law of the informant. There is no specific allegation against the petitioner and there is no injury report of the informant on the record. The charge sheet has been filed against the petitioner vide charge sheet no. 04/2026 dated 27-01-2026.</p> <p>Therefore, keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the case, I am inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned court below within one month from today upon furnishing bail bonds to the tune of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each subject to the satisfaction of court concerned.
