	<u>08-06-2026</u>	The present petition for regular bail has been filed on behalf of accused/petitioner namely Dhanjee Nat as he is in custody since 01.05.2026. The case of the prosecution, in brief is that the informant Ritik Kumar gave a typed application to the officer-in-charge of Bahoranpur Police Station stating that on 30.04.2026, at about 09:30 PM, upon hearing a commotion outside his house, the informant went out and found that four persons were taking away his buffalo and a bull after beating them with ropes. He, along with other villagers, chased them and managed to apprehend two individuals, while the remaining two escaped under cover of darkness. The apprehended persons disclosed their names as 1. Ankit Ojha S/o- Om Prakash Ojha 2. Dhanji Nut, S/o- Late Rajan Nut and also revealed the names of the two absconding individuals as 1. Sudama Yadav S/o- Shivkalma Yadav 2. Chotu Tiwari S/o- Jitendra Tiwari. Learned counsel for petitioner submitted that the petitioner is quite innocent and has committed no offence. The petitioner has been falsely implicated in this false case with ulterior motive only with a view to take revenge. No such occurrence ever took place as alleged in the FIR nor the time, manner, place and genesis of the occurrence are true and correct. Nothing has been recovered from the person and possession nor any iota of evidence against him to connect with the alleged offence. Petitioner is suffering from

several diseases and now he is admitted at Sadar Hospital Ara and struggle with life and death. Petitioner has been made suspected accused in Bihiya P.S. Case No. 144/2023 and Bihiya P.S. Case No. 165/2024 and is on bail in these cases.

Learned Additional Public Prosecutor has opposed the prayer of bail.

Arguments heard and record perused.

From the perusal of the record, it transpires that the allegation against the petitioner is that he tried to steal the animals. Petitioner has two criminal antecedents. The petitioner is admitted in Sadar Hospital, Ara. The petitioner is in custody since 01.05.2026.

Therefore, keeping in view the facts and circumstances of this case, I am inclined to admit the petitioner to bail upon furnishing bail bonds to the tune of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each subject to the satisfaction of the court concerned. The bail petition is accordingly **allowed**.
