Pending Anticipatory Bail Petition filed on behalf of the petitioner named above, who apprehends her arrest in connection with Buxar Industrial Area P.S. Case No.22/2026 U/s 135 Electricity Act is put up and moved today.

Copy of Bail Petition has already been served to the learned Public Prosecutor for the Prosecution.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner certifies that no other bail petition has ever been filed on behalf of the petitioner in this matter either before this Court or before any other Superior Court. The petitioner has no criminal antecedents. Prosecution has no objection to the submissions.

The Counsel further submits that, petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence and has been falsely implicated in this case. The petitioner is legal consumer of Electricity Department and pays her electricity bill on time. The petitioner has not intentionally committed any default. It is further submitted that, the petitioner has deposited Rs.15,690/- as 01st installment vide transaction reference no.SB2603090627 dated 09.03.2026 and furnished a photocopy of the receipt in the Court. It is further submitted that the petitioner is also ready to pay the rest amount of Rs.15,000/- in 03 equal monthly installments each of Rs.5,000/- and each monthly installment will be paid in 01st week of 03 consecutive months. The petitioner has never committed the theft of electricity before and she is ready to obey the directions of the Court and co-operate in Trial. Therefore, petitioner deserves to be enlarged on anticipatory bail.

Learned Public Prosecutor and learned Counsel for the Electricity Department do not oppose the prayer for anticipatory bail subject to her depositing the due amount.

Thus, considering the submissions of both the learned Counsels, the

material available on record and the compoundable nature of the offence alleged, the anticipatory bail petition of the petitioner named above is hereby allowed on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned Trial Court in the event of her arrest or surrender before the learned Trial Court within 04 weeks period from today subject to conditions as laid down u/s 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (B.N.S.S.) [earlier 438(2) Cr.P.C.].

Further learned Counsel for the petitioner by files a petition and moves that the petitioner has deposited Rs.15,690/- as his first installment approx 50% of his total outstanding amount and prays for reconnection of his electricity connection, on which learned Counsel for Electricity Department and learned P.P. have no objection.

In view of the same and considering the fact that electricity is an essential need, the petitioner is advised to contact the Electricity Department for reconnection of electricity. The Department may proceed on her request as per law.
