Anticipatory Bail Petition filed on behalf of petitioner **Jhunjhun Ram @ Jhunmun Ram** aged about 44 years, S/o Bahadur Ram, who is apprehending his arrest in connection with **Nawanagar P.S. Case No. 43/2014**, registered u/s 147, 323, 341, 379, 504 of I.P.C. is put up and moved today.

Copy of bail petition has already been served to the Ld. P.P. for the prosecution.

Sri Bishal Kumar Singh, Learned Counsel for the petitioner certifies that no other bail petition has ever been filed on behalf of the petitioner in this matter either before this Court or before any Superior Court. The petitioner has got no criminal antecedent. Prosecution has no objection to the submissions.

Learned Counsel for the petitioner further submits that, petitioner is quite innocent and has been falsely implicated in the present case. The prosecution story is false and concocted. The petitioner and informant are co-sharers. Petitioner was given benefit of Section 41(1) of Cr.P.C. during investigation and he never misused the same. Due to illiteracy and lack of knowledge about the legal process the petitioner could not appear before the Court and process u/s 82 Cr.P.C. got issued against him. Therefore, petitioner deserves to be enlarged on anticipatory bail.

Sri Kedar Nath Tiwari, Learned P.P. for the State vehemently opposes the Bail Petition and submits that, in the instant case the learned Court took cognizance of offence u/s 147, 323, 341, 504, 379 of I.P.C. against the petitioner and others on 15.05.2014 and since then the record is pending for appearance of the petitioner. The considerable delay shows that he was fleeing from the process of law. Also, process u/s 82 Cr.P.C. has already been issued against the petitioner on 20.11.2025. Hence, prayed to reject the anticipatory bail of the petitioner.

Prosecution case in brief according to written petition of **informant Kameshwar Ram** is that, on 18.02.2014 1. Uttam Ram and 2. Kawlesh Ram came at

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his home and started abusing him. When family of informant objected then 3. Gopal Ram, 4. Bahadur Ram, 5. Jhunjhun Ram the petitioner, 6. Hulash Ram, 7. Jhalki Devi, 8. Ashok Ram and 9. Chandan Kumar came and assaulted his wife and mother and injured them. Ashok Ram snatched silver necklace from wife of informant.

Heard learned Counsel of both parties and perused the case record. The perusal of record shows that the petitioner enjoyed the benefit of Section 41(A) Cr.P.C. during investigation. After completion of investigation the I.O. submitted charge-sheet no.60/2014 dated 30.4.2014 u/s 147, 323, 341, 504 of I.P.C. against the petitioner and other co-accused persons. The Trial Court took cognizance of offence u/s 147, 323, 341, 504, 379 of I.P.C. against the petitioner and others on 15.05.2014 and summoned the petitioner. Since then the record is pending for appearance of petitioner. The learned Court issued summons³, B.Ws. and N.B.Ws. during three years yet petitioner never appeared before the learned Court. Finally on 22.11.2025, the process u/s 82 Cr.P.C. were issued against him.

Thus, considering submissions of both sides and fact and circumstances of the case and guidelines issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of **Lavesh vs State (NCT Of Delhi) 2012 (8) SCC 730**, I am not inclined to enlarge the petitioner **Jhunjhun Ram @ Jhunmun Ram** on anticipatory bail. Hence, the present anticipatory bail is hereby **Rejected**. The petitioner is however advised to surrender before the learned Trial Court.
