ORDER

1. The present application has been filed on behalf of the above-named petitioners seeking the privilege of anticipatory bail in connection with Mahila P.S. Case No. 55 of 2025, dated 07.05.2025, registered under Sections 85, 82(1), 115(2), 351(2) and 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), which is presently pending in the Court of the learned S.D.J.M., Darbhanga.
2. The prosecution case, in brief, is that all the eleven accused persons, who are the in-laws of the informant, allegedly subjected the informant to cruelty and harassment. It is further

alleged that the husband of the informant, namely **Md. Asadullah**, has also contracted a second marriage with another woman.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the petitioners are innocent and have been falsely implicated in the present case. It is further submitted that the petitioners have no criminal antecedents. It is also contended that all the petitioners are relatives and in-laws of the informant and that the allegations made against them are general and omnibus in nature, without any specific overt act attributed to them. It is further submitted that the petitioners were served notice by the police under Section 35(3) of the BNSS and have cooperated with the investigation. The investigation against the petitioners is stated to have been completed and, therefore, there is no likelihood of tampering with the evidence or influencing the witnesses.
4. The Learned Public Prosecutor opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail.
5. Having considered the facts and circumstances of the case, the nature of allegations, and the submissions advanced on behalf of the parties, and further keeping in view that no specific allegations have been made against the petitioners and the investigation against them is stated to have been completed, this Court is inclined to grant the privilege of anticipatory bail to the

petitioners. Accordingly, in the event of arrest or surrender, the
petitioners named above are directed to be released on
anticipatory bail on furnishing a bail bond of ₹10,000/- (Rupees
Ten Thousand only) each with two sureties of the like amount, to
the satisfaction of the learned Court concerned.
