ORDER

20.04.2026

1. The petitioners above named sought anticipatory bail in connection with Mabbi P.S. Case No 15/26 registered for the offences under Section 126(2), 115(2), 110, 352, 3(5) of the Bhartiya Nyay Sanhita (hereinafter referred to as 'BNS' for short).
2. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners submitted that he were innocent and had not committed any offence. It was further submitted that petitioners had not filed bail petition of any sort earlier this court or either before any superior court. It was also submitted that there was no criminal antecedent against this petitioners. It was also submitted that the the informant wanted to grab the land and home property of the petitioners by false and fabricated stories. It was further submitted that the entire alleged allegations had been preserved in CCTV camera which would clarify the entire matter. It was also alleged that the local persons had also seen the entire matter and

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had given written report along with their signature which will clarify the matter. It was submitted that the petitioners were ready to abide by the condition(s) imposed upon him by the learned court. The learned counsel prayed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

3. Learned Public Prosecutor opposed the petition and prayed to reject it.
4. Heard both the sides, perused the case record and the case diary.
5. The allegation against the petitioner is that they brutally assaulted the informant, her husband and mother. Informant's skull was injured by hitting with a piece of brick.
6. Both the sides are the descendants of a common ancestor and the dispute arose due to some land. The injury report of the injured informant shows the injury to be simple in nature. The petitioners have no criminal antecedents.
7. In the facts and circumstances as discussed above, the instant anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of the petitioners namely **Ram Awtar Sharma, Chande Sharma, and Raj Kumar Sharma** is hereby **allowed**. In the event of arrest or surrender by the petitioners within 21 (Twenty One) days of receipt/production of this order, they are directed to be released on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned jurisdictional court concerned with an undertaking as stipulated under Section 482(2) of the BNSS.
8. It is made clear that this order has no bearing on the merits of the case.

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9. Let a copy of this order be sent to the concerned jurisdictional court.
10. Let this case record be deposited in the Record Room, Civil Court, Darbhanga after all due diligence.
