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ORDER

15-05-2026 **01.** The petitioners above named seeks pre-arrest bail u/s 482 of the B.N.S.S. in connection with Sadar PS Case No.- 84/2026 registered for the offences U/s- 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 352, 303(2), 3(5) of the BNS. Copy of the petition supplied to the Ld. Public Prosecutor.

02. As per the prosecution story, in short, is that the informant stated that on dated 05-03-2026 at about 08:30 P.M. the informant had gone to participate in a “Feast(Bhoj)” where the above named accused persons were also present. Accused Prince Kumar Mandal, holding a pistol in his hand, held him to his “Kanpatti” and took Rs. 6500/- from his pocket. Accused Bhavesh Mandal, holding an iron pickaxe in his hand, hit him from behind with the intent to kill, causing a head injury and snatching a 10gm gold chain from his neck. Accused Vishwanath Mandal, with the intent to kill , hit him with the butt of a spade, causing a further head injury. He lost a lot of blood, causing him to faint and collapse. Other person Jagdish Mandal took him to D.M.C.H. and got him treated. On the basis of which this F.I.R. got registered in Sadar Police Station.

03. Learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that the petitioners are innocent and have committed no offence. It has stated that the petitioners have not filed any bail petition prior to this either in this court or Hon’ble High Court Patna and no such petition is pending any where. It is further alleged that petitioners have no criminal antecedent. It has stated that the entire allegation levelled against the petitioners is false and concocted one. The petitioners have falsely been implicated in this case due to local party politics and enmity. As a mater of fact prosecution party were creating nuisance in

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the “Bhoj” in drunken condition and subsequently started assaulting each other which was pacified by these petitioner but subsequently they were implicated in this case. As per the material available in the record, there is no case made out against these petitioners. Hence, it is prayed that the petitioners may be enlarged on anticipatory bail.

04. On the other hand, learned P. P. opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioners.

05. Heard and perused the record, the main allegation against the petitioners is that on the day and time of the occurrence all these accused-petitioners ambushed the informant and attacked him with pistol and iron made weapons in which he was injured on his head. He lost a lot of blood, causing him to faint and collapse. It has also alleged that the petitioners took out Rs. 65,000/- from the pocket of the informant and also abused them. As per the F.I.R., the case has been registered u/s 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 352, 303(2), 3(5) of the B.N.S. All the above sections are bailable except u/s 118(1) and 303(2) only both appear to be superaddition.

06. Hence the instant petition for anticipatory bail of petitioners is allowed and it is ordered that the petitioners will be furnished a bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the condition under the provision of section 482(2) B.N.S.S. Petitioners are directed to co-operate into the trial and shall appear physically or well represented on each and every date of hearing in the Ld. Court below failing which Ld. Court below may proceed the cancel the bail granted the petitioners.
