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ORDER

07. 24.04.2026 The petitioner above named is serving judicial custody since 20.03.2026 in connection with aforesaid case and hence instant petition for grant of regular bail has been filed on his behalf. The copy of the bail petition has been served on learned I/c Special P.P.

The prosecution case in-brief is that informant namely Arvind Kumar currently working as Sub-Inspector under RPF post Darbhanga. It is further alleged that on 23.01.2026 an information was received from In-charge Inspector that Head constable Dinesh Kumar Prasad, deployed on Sakri Camping Duty, received information at 07.50 Hrs that two individuals were detained with a narcotic substance similar to ganja(Weed) at the western end of the newly constructed administrative building on platform no. 1 of Sakri Railway Station. Upon information, In-charge Inspector Pukhraj Meena, Assistant Sub-Inspector Amit Kumar, Constable Subhash Chandra Bose from RPF Post Darbhanga and Assistant Sub-Inspector Akash Ranjan Kumar from Special Branch Samastipur departed for Darbhanga, and simultaneously, the In-charge Inspector informed the Assistant Security Commissioner Samastipur regarding the above. At about 11.30 AM, everyone reached Sakri Station and found Head Constable Dinesh Kumar Prasad and two individual sitting with their luggage on platform no. 1. Upon interrogation by the informant in the presence of superior

officers, the apprehended individuals gave their names as Vijay Kumar and Vikash Kumar. Upon further interrogation, it was told that a person named Arun Kumar, gave us 06 packets of ganja in different bags in Raghapur with instructions to deliver the same at Darbhanga Railway Station in lieu of Rs. 7,000/-. Thereafter, in compliance with the mandatory provisions of the NDPS Act, notices under Section 50 were served upon them and , on their consent, search was conducted before a Gazetted officer. During search, 12 packets of Ganja weighing a total of 12.120 Kg were recovered from their possession, which were duly weighed, sealed and seized in presence of witnesses. Apart from the contraband, mobile phones, cash and other personal belongings were also recovered and seized. Despite efforts, no independent witness agreed to join the proceedings. Accordingly, seizure lists and arrest memos were prepared on the spot, duly signed by the accused and witnesses and both accused were arrested and the seized articles along with relevant documents were forwarded to the concerned police station for registration of the case.

Learned counsel for petitioner submitted that petitioner is innocent and he has committed no offence what so ever as alleged. It is further submitted that nothing has been recovered from the conscious possession of petitioner and he has unreasonably been implicated into instant case on account of previous enmity. Learned counsel further submitted that petitioner has no manner of concern with the seized intoxicated ganja, so alleged to have been recovered. He further submitted that there is no any criminal antecedents. He further submitted that accused petitioner is in jail custody since 20.03.2026. It is, therefore, prayed petitioner be allowed regular bail.

The learned I/c Special P.P. opposed the prayer for bail of both petitioner.

Heard the parties and perused the record. There is no recovery of contraband from the possession of accused petitioner and he was arrested from his house on 20-03-2026. He was merely named by the accused persons, who was arrested with the Ganja. Petitioner has no criminal antecedent and he is in custody since 20-03-2026.

Therefore, considering the above facts and circumstances of the case, clean criminal antecedent coupled with period of custody, prayer for bail made on behalf of accused petitioner is **allowed**. It is, therefore, ordered that the accused- petitioner is

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directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each with a condition that he will not commit such occurrence in future and he also cooperate in the investigation / trial of the case. He will not temper the witnesses and petitioner will not get himself involved in the offence of similar nature and in case of default, prosecution shall be at liberty to initiate cancellation of bail of accused petitioner.
