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ORDER.

03. 24.06.2026. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned P.P. for the State assisted with the learned counsel for the informant on anticipatory bail filed on behalf of above named petitioner, who is apprehending his arrest in connection with Darbhanga Mahila PS Case No. 58 of 2024 for offences U/Ss 341, 323, 498A and 504/34 of the IPC.

2. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned P.P. for the State and perused the case record.

3. As per FIR, prosecution case in-brief is that the marriage of the informant was solemnized with accused petitioner namely Awdhesh Sah @ Awdhesh Kr. Sah on 02.12.2021. After marriage informant went to her matrimonial house with gifted items of clothes, utensils, furniture, gold and silver jewellery and a cash of Rs. 1,01,000/-. After marriage informant gave birth to her daughter out of her wedlock. It is further alleged that husband of the informant demanded Rs. 75,000/- from the informant and upon non-fulfillment of the same they abused, assaulted and tortured her in various ways. It is further alleged that on 04.04.2024 her husband bring her and her daughter and left her and her daughter at her Naihar and fled away saying unless your father gave Rs. 75,000/- he will not took them to the matrimonial home.

4. Learned counsel for petitioner submitted that the petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence. It is further submitted that the entire allegations as alleged in the FIR is totally false and baseless. He further submitted that the informant herself went to her Naihar along with her child and filed this false case against the informant and his

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family members. It is further submitted that the allegation against the petitioner is only omnibus in nature. The learned counsel for the petitioner further submitted that the petitioner is ready to take his wife from her Maika with proper Bidai and submitted that he wanted to keep his wife with full honour, dignity and care. It is further alleged that accused petitioner has no any criminal antecedent against the accused petitioner. It is, therefore, prayed to enlarge the petitioner on anticipatory bail.

5. The learned Public Prosecutor opposed the prayer for bail.

6. Learned private counsel of the informant did not oppose the bail of the petitioner as petitioner is ready to keep his wife(informant) with dignity and care.

7. The informant as well as accused petitioner are in attendance with Court and ready to live with mutual care and dignity.

8. Heard the parties and perused the record. Considering the above facts and circumstances of the case discussed above as well as undertaking of accused petitioner, the instant petition for anticipatory bail of Petitioner is **allowed** and it is ordered that in the event of arrest or surrender before the court below within a period of fortnight from the receipt of this order, the petitioner shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the condition under the provision of section 438(2) of the CrPC.

9. The petitioner will keep his wife and children with care and dignity.

10. Learned Judicial Magistrate is expected to explore the possibility of an amicable settlement between the parties.
