ORDER

05.06.2026

1. The petitioners above named sought anticipatory bail in connection with LNMU P.S. Case No 211/2023 registered for the offences under Section 341, 303, 307, 325, 504, 506, 34 of the Indian Penal Code (hereinafter referred to as 'IPC' for short).
2. The anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of the petitioner nos. 2 and 3 has already been dismissed as withdrawn vide order dated 02.06.2026.
3. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners no. 1, 4 and 5 submitted that they were innocent and had not committed any offence. It was further submitted that petitioners had not filed bail petition of any sort earlier before this court or either before any superior court. It was also submitted that the petitioners had no previous criminal antecedents. It was further submitted that the prosecution case was totally false and baseless and no such occurrence took place as alleged by the prosecution. It was further stated that the petitioners had been falsely implicated in this case due to land dispute. It was further alleged that the accused Md. Gulab @ Gulab Ahmad, Zafir Ahmad @ Jafir Ahmad, Saquib Zainullah @ Md. Sakib Jainullah, Mosarat Khatoon and Rashida Khatoon had been granted bail vide Criminal Miscellaneous No. 20975/2024 vide order dated 04.04.2024 and Md. Parweej Ahmad has been granted bail vide Criminal Miscellaneous No. 15510/2024 vide order dated 12.03.2024 and accused Md. Zahir Ansari @ Zahir Ahmad and Jahanam Behum @ Najani Parween have been granted bail vide Criminal Miscellaneous No. 18263/2024 vide order dated 14.03.2024. It was submitted that the petitioners were ready to abide by the condition(s) imposed upon him by the learned court. The learned counsel prayed for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.

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4. Learned Public Prosecutor opposed the petition and prayed to reject it.
5. Heard both the sides, perused the case record and the Learned Trial Court Record.
6. The allegation against the petitioners is that they along with other accused persons armed with deadly weapons assaulted the informant and his family members and injured the informant by fracturing his hand and informant's nephews Shajid and Shakeer injured on their head. Irshad fingers were fractured while the informant's son was also injured.
7. There was general and omnibus allegation against the petitioners. The petitioners were not sent up by the police but the Learned CJM took cognizance of offence against them along with other accused persons. The petitioners have no criminal antecedents.
8. In the facts and circumstances as discussed above, the instant anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of the petitioners namely **1. Md. Nasim Ahmad, 4. Md. Ekram and 5. Nargis Bano @ Chandani** is hereby **allowed**. In the event of arrest or surrender by the petitioners within 21 (Twenty One) days of receipt/production of this order, they are directed to be released on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned jurisdictional court concerned with an undertaking as stipulated under Section 438(2) of the Cr.P.C.
9. It is made clear that this order has no bearing on the merits of the case.
10. Let a copy of this order be sent to the concerned Jurisdictional Court.
11. Let this case record be deposited in the Record Room, Civil Court, Darbhanga after all due diligence.
