ORDER

21.07.2026

1. The petitioner above named sought regular bail in connection with Laheriasarai P.S. Case No 342/2026 registered for the offence under Sections 10 of Bihar Conduct of Examination, Section 318(4), 61(2) of the Bhartiya Nyay Sanhita and Section 66 D of Information Technology Act (hereinafter referred to as 'BNS', 'BCE' and 'IT' for short). The petitioner has been in judicial custody since 20.06.2026.
2. The Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submitted that he was innocent and had not committed any offence. It was also submitted that the petitioner had not filed bail petition of any sort earlier this court or either before any superior court. It was also submitted that the petitioner has no previous criminal antecedent. It was alleged that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case. It was also submitted that the petitioner as come to Examination Centre on alleged date of occurrence as his friend had to appear in the examination in 1st sitting but his friend has not reached the examination centre in time and as such the petitioner was waiting for him. It was alleged that there was no incriminating article has been recovered from the possession of the petitioner. It was also alleged that no case offence u/s 318(4) BNS & Section 10 BC of examination Act & Section 10 of public examination prevention of unfair means act is made out and other section isailable. It was submitted that the petitioner was ready to abide by the condition(s) imposed upon him by the learned court. The learned counsel prayed for grant of regular bail to the petitioner.
3. The Learned Public Prosecutor opposed the petition and prayed to reject it.
4. Heard both the sides, perused the case record and the case diary.
5. The allegation against the petitioner is that outside the examination center Marwari Mahavidyalay College, Darbhanga Center in connection with the examination of Central Selection Board of Constable Recruitment he was found to have a blue bag containing wakie-talkie, charger, admit card and a mobile set about which he stated that the same was to have been used for unfair means in the second sitting of the examination.

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6. The petitioner was found outside the examination center and not inside the hall. The petitioner has been in custody since 20.06.2026. The petitioner has no criminal antecedent.
7. In the facts and circumstances as discussed above, the instant regular bail petition filed on behalf of the petitioner namely **Praduman Kumar @ Aman Kumar** is hereby **allowed**. The petitioner is directed to be released on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each with an undertaking under Section 480(3) of the BNSS subject to the satisfaction of the Learned Jurisdictional Court with a further condition that he will not get himself involved in offences of similar nature in future.
8. In case of subsequent involvement of petitioner in the offence of similar nature in future, the prosecution shall be at liberty to initiate appropriate proceeding for cancellation of his bail and the learned jurisdictional court shall pass an order as if the bail has been granted by itself without further reference to this court.
9. It is made clear that this order has no bearing on the merits of the case.
10. Let a copy of this order be sent to the concerned Jurisdictional Court.
11. Let this case record be deposited in the Record Room, Civil Court, Darbhanga after all due diligence.
