ORDER

1. The petitioner is praying for regular bail in connection with Pator PS Case No.- 123 of 2025, Dated- 11.12.2025, U/s- 126(2), 115(2), 109(1), 74, 352, 351(2), 3(5) of the BNS is pending in the court of Ld ACJM-IX, Darbhanga. The petitioner is in judicial custody since 12.12.2025.
2. The brief prosecution case, as alleged in the FIR, is that on 11.12.2025 at about 8:30 A.M., the husband of the informant, namely Rishikesh Kumar Singh, was proceeding towards the market. When he reached near the house of Ramadhar Singh, the present petitioner allegedly caught hold of him, and the other accused persons namely Amit Kumar, Kesar Singh, Prince Singh and Jyotish Kumar, who were already present there, started assaulting Rishikesh Kumar Singh. It is further alleged that at the instigation and order of the present petitioner, the co-accused persons assaulted the victim with lathi, rod and talwar. When the informant reached the place of occurrence to rescue her husband, she was also allegedly assaulted by the accused persons.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence. It is further submitted that the petitioner has clean antecedents. Learned counsel also contends that there exists a land dispute between the parties, and earlier the husband of the informant and others had assaulted the petitioner and his wife, for which a case being Pator P.S. Case No. 31 of 2025 was lodged. It is further submitted that although there is allegation against the petitioner, he is stated to be

only an order giver, and no specific overt act of assault has been attributed to him.

4. On the other hand, learned Public Prosecutor has opposed the prayer for bail and submitted that the witnesses have supported the prosecution case. It is further argued that repeated blows were inflicted on the head region of Rishikesh Kumar Singh, which is a vital part of the body, and the injuries sustained by him have been found to be grievous in nature.
5. Having considered the facts and circumstances of the case, the nature of the allegations, and particularly the fact that repeated blows were allegedly inflicted on the vital part of the victim, namely the head region, resulting in grievous injury, this Court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner at this stage.
