ORDER

27.04.2026 The present anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of petitioners namely 1.Ranjeet Sahani, aged about 32 years, S/o Sone Sahani and 2.Paro Devi, aged about 30 years, W/o Ranjeet Sahani, Both resident of village – Harsinghpur Navtoliya, P.S. Bahera, Distt. - Darbhanga, in connection with C.R. No. 61/2018 in which prima facie case was found u/s 498(A), 494 of IPC, which is pending in the court of Ld. A.C.J.M., Benipur.

Heard Sri Chandra Bhushan Jha, Ld. Counsel for the petitioners and Smt. Punam Jha, Ld. Counsel for the state.

The prosecution case as stated in brief in complaint petition is that complainant got married with accused Ranjeet Sahani in the year 2012 as per Hindu rites and customs. That the complainant's husband along with his family members started to demand motorcycle upon which complainant's family members accepted the demand and gave her husband one motorcycle. That the complainant's husband along with his family members again started demanding of cattle (buffalo) upon which complainant refused to give. That then accused persons including his family members started torturing the complainant physically and mentally. That complainant's husband also solemnized second marriage with one Paro Kumari. That complainant's husband came to take the complaint from her sister's house on 04.04.2017 upon which complainant's husband took the complainant to his house where she lived happily for two months. That after two months, complainant's husband again took his second wife in his house. That the accused persons started to demand buffalo again and on non-fulfillment of the same they abused and assaulted her in various ways. That on 30.0.2018 complainant came to her maternal house due to torturous act of accused persons.

The Counsel for the petitioners has submitted that this application for grant of anticipatory bail on behalf of the above named petitioners who are apprehending their arrest of a non-bailable offence in

the above mentioned case. That no bail petition either ABP or regular have ever been filed on behalf of these petitioners either before this Ld. Court or before any Hon'ble High Court, Patna prior to this. That no criminal history behind these petitioners rather petitioner No. 1 has been made accused in the case of Bahera P.S. Case No. 04/17 u/s 498(A), 494/4 of the IPC and ¾ of the D.P. lodged by this complainant and Bahera P.S. Case No. 223/20 and Bahera P.S. Case No. 227/25 which has been granted bail. That the Ld. ACJM, Benipur examined the complainant on solemn affirmation and after examination of the few witnesses took cognizance of the offences against these petitioners and others co-accused for the offence u/s 498(A), 494 of the IPC vide order dated 26.11.2019. That the petitioners are quite innocent and have committed no offence. That the petitioners have been falsely implicated in this case due to grudge malice and local politics only. That the petitioner No. 1 Ranjeet Sahani is the husband of the complainant Rekha Devi whereas the petitioner No. 2 Paro Devi is the so called 2nd wife of this petitioner No. 1. That as a matter of fact no such type of the occurrence find take place as alleged in the complaint petition rather the complainant to this case lodged one after another case against these petitioners since regarding the aspect one Bahera P.S. Case No. 04/17, G.R. No. 6/17 for the offence u/s 498(A), 494 of IPC and ¾ of the D.P. Act is pending in the court of the Ld. S.D.J.M. Benipur. That according to the panchayat all the furniture, jewelry ,dishes etc give to the parents of the complainant has taken away and has also execute by the father of the petitioner No. 1 Ranjeet Sahani. That some of the accused persons to this case have been granted ABP by this Ld. Court vide ABP 338/25 since it has been sent to Mediation Centre, Benipur where the complainant refused to compromise the case. That the petitioners belongs to the respectable family of the locality and as such there is no chance of their absconding or tempering of the evidence. That the petitioners are ready to furnish the bail bond to the satisfaction of the Ld. Court of the ACJM, Benipur. That the petitioners are ready to abide by the condition or conditions laid down under Section 482(2) BNSS. Hence, it was prayed that the accused petitioners may be granted bail.

On the other hand Ld. Counsel of the State has opposed the prayer for bail submitting that the offences are grave in nature, hence the bail petition of the petitioners may be rejected.

Heard, Submissions of both parties and perused the record. From perusal of record, it has been found that this is complaint base case in which warrant has been issued. From perusal of record, it has also been found that despite of compliance of notice, the opposite party did not appear before court although she appeared before court in bail proceeding against other family members which shows that she has knowledge about the case. The counsel of the petitioner submitted Annexure IV where he showed that the petitioner became ready to end the relation on receiving some money and other items. That the offences under which prima facie case has been found have maximum punishment up to 07 years. So, considering the discussion made and under these circumstances, this court finds it proper to **allow** the bail petition of the petitioners 1.**Ranjeet Sahani**, aged about 32 years, S/o Sone Sahani and 2.**Paro Devi**, aged about 30 years, W/o Ranjeet Sahani, Both resident of village – Harsinghpur Navtoliya, P.S. Bahera, Distt. - Darbhanga. That in case of arrest or surrender within a period of three weeks of receipt

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of this order by the Ld. Court, the accused petitioners are directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/-(Rs. Ten Thousands/-) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the court and with the condition that accused-petitioners shall remain physically present till three consecutive date before Ld. Trial court.
