ORDER

30.07.2026 The present application for anticipatory bail has been filed on behalf of petitioner namely Suraj Jha, S/o Mangnu Jha, Vill Mahinam, PS Bahera, Dist. Darbhanga, who is apprehending his arrest in connection with Bahera P.S. Case No. 208/2020, u/s 147, 149, 341, 323, 325, 307, 379, 504, 506 of IPC and which is pending in the Court of ACJM, Benipur, Darbhanga.

Heard Sri Amit Kumar, the Ld. Counsel for the petitioner and Smt. Punam Jha, Ld. A.P.P. on behalf of the State.

The prosecution case as stated in FIR is that on dated 20.06.2020 at around 4:30 PM when the informant was at his shop, the accused person named in FIR including this petitioner came there with tengari, rod, chain, lathi and danda and started to abuse the informant in filthy language. It is alleged that co-accused Govind Mishra having tengari in his hand assaulted on the head of the informant and he fell down. It is further alleged that when the elder brother of the informant namely Shambhu Nath Jha, nephew Abhishek Jha and his son Anand Jha came to rescue the informant, co-accused Gautam Jha and Shambhu Jha started to assault them also, as a result Abhishek Jha received injury on his head, co-accused Ankit Mishra assaulted his son Anand Jha with rod and Girdhari Mishra assaulted Shambhu Nath Jha with rod as a result they received serious injury and fell down. The accused persons further looted away cash of Rs. 12,000/- from the cash box of the shop. Later on, upon alarm being raised, the accused persons fled away and the injured were taken to PHC, Bahera and from there to DMCH.

The Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is apprehending his arrest in connection with above mentioned case. That prior to this no bail petition either anticipatory or regular has ever been filed by the petitioner in this court or in the Hon'ble High Court, Patna and no such petition is pending anywhere. That the petitioner has no criminal antecedent. That the petitioner is quite innocent and has committed no offence. That entire allegations leveled against the petitioner is false and concocted. That no such occurrence did ever take place as alleged in FIR. That all the sections are bailable except sec. 307 & 379 of IPC, which is not made out against the petitioner. That there is no any specific allegation made

out against this petitioner in the entire FIR. That at the alleged date and time of occurrence your petitioner was not present in the village, rather he was under treatment as his mind was disturbed. That the case has been compromised in between the parties for which a separate compromise along with permission petition is being filed herewith. That the petitioner is ready to furnish bail bond with sufficient sureties to the satisfaction of the Ld. Court. That the petitioner is a local person and man of means and as such there is no chance of his absconding. Hence, petitioner request before Court to grant his bail. And for that this petitioner shall ever pray.

On the other hand Ld. APP appearing for the State and Ld. Counsel for the informant have opposed the prayer for bail and submitted that the offence is grave in nature hence the anticipatory bail petition of the petitioner may be rejected.

Heard, Submissions of both parties and perused the record. From perusal of the case records, it can be seen that this case has been filed u/s 147, 149, 341, 323, 325, 307, 379, 504, 506 of IPC. That there is no specific allegation against the petitioner. That co-accused who were on similar footing were granted bail. That there is no criminal antecedent of the petitioner as stated by the Ld. Counsel of the petitioner. So in the light of these facts and circumstances and considering the facts that there is no criminal antecedent of the petitioner, this Court finds it proper to **allow** the anticipatory bail petition of this petitioner namely **Suraj Jha**, S/o Mangnu Jha, Vill Mahinam, PS Bahera, Dist. Darbhanga. That in case of arrest or surrender within a period of three weeks of receipt of this order by the concerned court, the accused petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/-(Rs. Ten Thousands/-) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the court below. Further with the condition that one bailor shall be near relative and petitioner shall remain physically present till framing of charge.
