Uma Pandit &amp; Others before the learned ACJM, Biraul, who made over the case to this Court for further inquiry and trial.</p> <p>The complainant got himself examined on oath and failed to produce any inquiry witness.</p> <p>The learned counsel for the complainant is not present.</p> <p>Perused the entire case record. Upon perusal of the material present on record, the statement of complainant on oath and statements of enquiry witnesses it transpires that a prima facie case no case is made out against the accused persons named in the complaint petition. There is no sufficient material on record to proceed against them. There is land dispute between parties. He has also stop doing parvi from after 07.07.22 it seems that he has lost interest in the case and the matter has been resolved outside the court.</p> <p>So, Sufficient material is not available on record to proceed under these sections.</p> <p>Therefore, in this light of above discussion I find that there is no ground to proceed further and hence the complaint petition is <b>Dismissed under section 203 of Crpc.</b> O/C is directed to consign the record to the record room.</p>	4
