ORDER

18.04.2026

Anticipatory Bail petition is pressed today by the Ld. Krishna Prasad on behalf of the above named accused/petitioners apprehending arrest in connection with Kotwa P.S. Case No. 32/2026 u/s 126(2), 191(2), 76, 115(2), 109, 303(2), 352, 351(2) and 3(5) of B.N.S. Copy of the petition has already been served to learned A.P.P. Informant and injured persons have appeared before the court and filed their attendance and stated that the matter has been compromised.

Ld. Counsel appearing on behalf of the accused/petitioners submit that no other bail petition either anticipatory or regular has ever been filed earlier either in this Ld. Court or before any other higher Court on behalf of the petitioners. The petitioners have no criminal antecedent. Petitioners are quite innocent and have very falsely implicated in this case malafidely. This case is already compromised between both the parties and certified copy of compromised with permission petition also annexed with this bail petition. It is therefore prayed that the court may pleased to admit this bail petition and petitioners shall ever pray.

The prosecution case in brief is that all accused persons along with four unknown persons came with common intention with weapons and started abusing. Mayank Kumar Singh caught hold of her husband and demanded extortion money, threatening to kill him if he refused. Then on instigation Mayank took a farsa and with the help of Chabbila Singh and Munni Singh who held her husband, Mayank attacked him on the head with the intention to kill, causing serious injury and unconsciousness. When she tried to save him, her minor son, her father-in-law and her father-in-law brother's were also assaulted by all the accused persons. During this incident Sonu Singh forcibly snatched her gold chain worth about Rs. 1,20,000/- and tore her clothes, outraging her modesty and publicly humiliating her. After the incident villagers took them to Sadar Hospital, Motihari.

Ld. A.P.P. opposed the same.

Heard and perusal of the case record, it reflects that the accused persons are named accused in the present FIR and the allegation against the accused/petitioners is that petitioner namely Mayank attacked on the head of the informant's husband with the intention to kill, causing serious injury and unconsciousness. All the accused persons assaulted the informant, her minor son, father-in-law, husband, father-in-law brother's has sustained the injury. Petitioner namely Sonu Singh forcibly snatched the gold chain of the informant worth about Rs. 1,20,000/- and tore her clothes, outraging her modesty and publicly humiliating her. In Para-02 of the case diary, restatement of informant and in para 05, 06 and 07 of the case diary the statement of witnesses have not fully supported the case of the prosecution. In para 19 of the case diary, the injury report of the informant Pratima Devi is mentioned in which the nature of the injury is simple in nature. In para 20 of the case diary, the injury report of the injured Chuman Singh is mentioned in which he sustained lacertated wound over forehead of size 1"x1/4"x1/6", the nature of injury is simple in nature but on vital part of the body. In para 21 of the case diary the injury report of the injured Rajnish Kumar is mentioned in which the nature of the injury is simple in nature. In para 22 of the case diary the injury report of the injured Chandeshwar Singh is mentioned. In para 23 of the case diary, the injury report of the injured Robin Singh is mentioned in which he sustained fracture of the distal diaphysis of proximal phalanx of thumb finger. Thus, the nature of the injury is grievous in nature. In para- 03 of the case diary, it is mentioned that petitioners have clean antecedent.. The case has been compromised between both the parties and compromise petition is duly signed by both the parties.

Considering the above discussed facts and circumstance of the case, nature of allegation, materials available in the case diary and the case has been compromise and having clean antecedent petitioners namely Mayank Kumar Singh, Chhabila Singh,

Munni Singh, Sonu Kumar Singh, Ritik Singh @ Gautam Bharadwaj. Hence, I am inclined to give privilege of pre-arrest bail to the petitioners namely Mayank Kumar Singh, Chhabila Singh, Munni Singh, Sonu Kumar Singh, Ritik Singh @ Gautam Bharadwaj. Accordingly, in the event of their arrest or surrender within three weeks from the date of receipt of copy of this order before the learned court below, the petitioners/accused, namely, **1. Mayank Kumar Singh 2. Chhabila Singh 3. Munni Singh 4. Sonu Kumar Singh 5. Ritik Singh @ Gautam Bharadwaj** are directed to be released on anticipatory bail, on furnishing their bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount in the aforesaid case, subject to condition as laid down u/s 482(2) of B.N.S.S., 2023.

O/C is directed to send the copy of the order to the Ld. Trial court forthwith.
