01. This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of Ranjeet Giri @ Ranjit Giri, S/O- Kedar Giri, aged about 48 years, Permanent R/O- Madanpur Dagar, P.S. Parshauni, District- Sitamadhi, Presently Residing of village- Bhuhairaw Khaptola, P.S. and District- Sitamadhi in connection with Dhaka (Pachpakari) P.S. Case No. 152/2016 under sections 364, 365/34 of the I.P.C.

02. The petitioner apprehends arrest in connection with the above-mentioned case on the allegations, inter-alia of kidnapping the son of the informant by unknown miscreants.

03. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is quite innocent and has committed no offence as alleged and has falsely been implicated in this case. Further stated that no other regular or anticipatory bail petition has been filed by the accused petitioner either in this court or before the Hon'ble High Court. Further stated that the petitioner has got no criminal antecedent. Further stated that the name of the petitioner has come in this case from the confessional statement of co-accused Rajesh Kumar @ Rajesh Rai. Further stated that the allegations, whatsoever, levelled against the petitioner are out and out false and concocted. Lastly it has been stated that the petitioner is ready to give sureties for the satisfaction of this court.

04. Learned Addl. Public Prosecutor opposed the prayer of bail and prayed for rejection of prayer of bail of petitioner.

05. Heard Ld. Counsel for the petitioner, Ld. A.P.P. for the state and perused the record.

06. From the perusal of record it shows that the name of the petitioner has surfaced in this case from the confessional statement of co-accused Rajesh Kumar @ Rajesh Rai. Further from the perusal of record including the case diary the chances of false accusations against the present petitioner at this stage are being ruled out. There is enough material on the record which makes a prima facie case

against the accused at this stage. Suffice it to say that one of the prime objects of anticipatory bail is to protect a person from false accusations. At this stage of the case, more particularly when the investigation is still in progress as per the record available, the case against the petitioner can not be disbelieved. In these circumstances, this court is not inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

07. Considering the above facts and circumstances, the anticipatory bail application moved by the petitioner namely Ranjeet Giri @ Ranjit Giri is hereby rejected.
