01. This bail petition has been filed on behalf of Vikash Kumar, S/O- Jitendra Sharma, aged about 25 years, R/O- Mangalpur Hussaini, P.S.- Dumariyaghat, Distt- East Champaran in connection with Dumariyaghat P.S. Case No. 01/2026 under sections 316(2), 318(4), 336(3), 340(2) of the B.N.S. & 12 of the Passport Act, 1967. Today, a compromise petition has been filed on behalf of the informant.

02. The petitioner is behind the bars since 10.03.2026 in connection with the above-mentioned case on the allegations of cheating the informant by providing him forged visa and flight ticket.

03. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence and has falsely been implicated in this case. Further stated that no other regular or anticipatory bail petition has been filed by the accused petitioner either in this court or before the Hon'ble High Court except ABP No. 672/26 which was withdrawn because the petitioner had arressed by the police. Further stated that the petitioner has got no criminal antecedent. Further stated that the petitioner has nothing to do with the alleged occurrence. Further stated that petitioner has not involved in any creation of false document. Also no any forged documents has been recovered from the conscious possession of the petitioner. Further stated that earlier transaction in between petitioner and informant took place, and petitioner is ready to return 75,000/- in installment. But only for interest money (60,000/-) and at instant of local villagers, informant create new story and lodged this false and fabricated case. Lastly it has been stated that the petitioner is ready to give sureties for the satisfaction of this court.

04. Learned Addl. Public Prosecutor vehemently opposed the prayer of bail and prayed for rejection of bail petition of petitioner.

05. Heard Ld. counsel for the petitioner, Ld. counsel for the informant and Ld. A.P.P. for the state and perused the record.

06. The informant is present before this court and has stated in the open court that he has received Rs. 1,000,00/- from the accused and has amicably settled the dispute with the accused/petitioner. He has further stated that he has no objection in case the accused is granted bail. From perusal of record it shows that the petitioner has got no criminal antecedent. Nothing whatsoever has been brought to the knowledge of the court from which it can be shown that the petitioner will hamper or tamper with the evidence in case he is enlarged on bail. In these circumstances, this court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner herein.

07. Considering the facts and circumstances discussed herein-above, period of detention and material available on record, the bail petition of the accused petitioner namely Vikash Kumar is allowed and he is directed to be released on bail after furnishing of bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount to the satisfaction of the Ld. Court below.
