This is an anticipatory bail petition filed on behalf of the petitioner, namely, (1) Munna Malik, (2) Mithun Malik, (3) Ranjan Malik, (4) Rinki Devi, (5) Urmila Devi, (6) Usha Devi and (7) Rajesh Malik, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Kalyanpur P.S. Case No. 222 of 2026 for the offence u/ss 115(2), 126(2), 118(1), 109(1), 303(2), 117(2), 3(5) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 (hereinafter B.N.S.).

During the course of hearing, petitioner Munna Malik was arrested by the police and remanded to judicial custody and his prayer for anticipatory bail petition has been dismissed as withdrawn vide order dt. 01.07.2026.

In para-2 of the anticipatory bail petition, it is mentioned that no other anticipatory or regular bail petition has been filed earlier on behalf of the petitioners either in this Court or before the Hon'ble Patna High Court. In para-3 of the anticipatory bail petition, it is mentioned that the petitioners has no criminal antecedent.

The prosecution case, in brief, as per written application of the informant Reena Devi, is that on 16.05.2026 at about 08:00 PM, accused Munna Malik had stolen her hen. When protested, Munna Malik assaulted her mother-in-law with dab on her

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head and injured her. The accused persons also assaulted her father-in-law. Further, they snatched *mangalsutra* and gold jewellery of the informant's sister-in-laws.

The learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that the petitioners are innocent, they have committed no offence, as alleged, and has falsely been implicated in this case. The allegations whatsoever levelled against the petitioners are out and out false and concocted. This case is counter-case of Kalyanpur P.S. Case No.223/2026 which was lodged by the petitioners side.

The learned Public Prosecutor appearing on behalf of State and learned counsel for the informant have opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

Heard both sides and perused the record. As per F.I.R, accused Munna Malik had stolen the informant's hen. When protested, Munna Malik assaulted her mother-in-law with dab on her head and injured her. The accused persons also assaulted her father-in-law. Further, they snatched *mangalsutra* and gold jewellery of the informant's sister-in-laws. As per para-3 of the anticipatory bail petition and para-37 of the case diary, the petitioners have no criminal antecedent. As per injury report attached with the case diary, Prabhawati Devi has sustained a lacerated wound on forehead of size 1/2" x 1/8" x 1/10" and Bhikhar Mali injuries are simple in nature caused by hard and blunt substance. As per para-44 of the case diary, the investigation is under progress.

Considering the above facts as discussed above, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to petitioners, namely, (1) Mithun Malik, (2) Ranjan Malik, (3) Rinki Devi, (4) Urmila Devi, (5) Usha Devi and (6) Rajesh Malik. Accordingly, in the event of their arrest or surrender before the learned court below within four weeks from the date of receipt of copy of this order, the petitioners, namely, **(1) Mithun Malik, (2) Ranjan Malik, (3) Rinki Devi, (4) Urmila Devi, (5) Usha Devi and (6) Rajesh Malik** are ordered to be **released** on anticipatory bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (Ten thousand rupees) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below in the aforesaid case subject to condition as laid-down u/s 482 (2) of the B.N.S.S.
