This bail petition has been pressed today for hearing on behalf of the petitioners namely **1. Munni Devi @ Bihi Devi, 2. Rita Devi @ Sindi Devi, 3. Rinki Kumari, 4. Ajit Kumar, 5. Pramod Chaudhary, 6. Benga Chudhary @ Pradip, 7. Ajay Chudhary, 8. Ganauri Chaudhary, 9. Dharmendra Chudhary, 10. Rajendra Chudhary, 11 Manoj Chaudhary @ Feku Chaudhary, 12. Krishna Chudhary, 13. Urmila Devi, 14. Anita Devi and 15. Rita Devi** who are apprehending their arrest in connection with this Sarbahda P.S. Case No. 43/2026 registered under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 303(2), 352, 351(2), 3(5) of B.N.S and 27 of Arms Act.

Heard learned counsel Sri Kundan Kumar appearing on behalf of the accused/Petitioners and learned A.P.P. for the State.

Apart from pleading innocence and false implication Ld. Counsel for the petitioners submit that allegation against petitioners are vague and omnibus in nature. Ld. Counsel further submits that there is dispute over land. Ld. Counsel further submits that there is case and counter case between both the parties. Ld. Counsel further submits that there is no specific allegation against the petitioners and any of the petitioner does not bear any criminal antecedent.

Ld. Counsel further submits that main accused Paras Chaudhary has been granted bail vide ABP No. 1288/26 and all the petitioners of this case stand on better footing.

In the light of said submissions Ld. Counsel for the petitioners pray for extending the protection of anticipatory bail.

The Ld. P.P has opposed the prayer of bail.

Heard both the sides. Perused the record.

The story of prosecution is based on written application of informant in brief is that Paras Chaudhary with his whole family attacked on informant's shop and destroyed his computer installed there and snatched cash amount from his counter. It is further alleged that they assaulted informant and threatened him on the gun point to register the land which was agreed to be sold as per agreement in 2022. Thereafter all the accused persons named in FIR assaulted him.

In the instant case, the allegations against petitioners are omnibus in nature. The alleged occurrence arose out of a land dispute. The informant has not specifically alleged any of petitioners to have inflicted injury over the vital part of body. Case was earlier also lodged by petitioners' side against informant of this case. The main accused has already been granted bail vide ABP No. 1288/2026 on 04.05.2026. Petitioners of this case stand on better footing.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of this case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the accused petitioners. If the accused petitioners appear before the learned trial Court below within a period of one month from the date of receipt of the order to trial court, they shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each.

This anticipatory bail application is hereby **allowed**.
