1. This anticipatory bail application has been filed and moved on behalf of above named accused petitioners, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Magadh Medical P.S. Case No. 22 of 2026 registered for the offences under Sections 191(2), 191(3), 190, 126(2), 115(2), 308(3), 109, 61(2) B.N.S.
2. Sri Ranjan Kumar Srivastav, the learned counsel has appeared to move this anticipatory bail prayer. The prosecution is represented by the Addl. Public Prosecutor.
3. The learned defence counsel has submitted that a free fight took place between the parties but any serious injury was not caused to informant. Any criminal antecedent has not been found against the petitioners. On these grounds, a prayer has been made for grant of anticipatory bail to the accused petitioners.
4. On the other hand, learned APP has submitted that the allegation of causing serious injury to informant is corroborated with the injury report which is on record, wherein informant received serious injuries one on head and other on nose, which also makes clear intention of the assailants to make an attempt to cause serious injuries.
5. The case of prosecution based on written application of informant, in brief is that, on 15.01.2026 at about 8:00 P.M. while he was passing through Magadh Colony Road no. 5 and 6, accused persons named in F.I.R. armed with deadly weapon surrounded informant's car bearing no. BR 02 BQ 7078 and started demanding a ransom of rupees four lakhs while abusing him. Thereafter they assaulted him with fists and kicks, and

Bhiman Yadav hit him with the butt of pistol. Due to assault, the informant fainted and fell down. Then, after issuing threat to kill him, accused persons fled away. It is further alleged that on 14.01.2026, they also assaulted his cousin brother Prince and demanded ransom from him too.

6. Heard the Ld. A.P.P. and the Ld. Counsel of defence and perused the case record. From perusal of the case record it transpires that, there is specific and direct allegation against the petitioners of demanding heavy ransom money of Rs.4,00,000/- and causing head and nose injury by fists and pistol to informant. From the perusal of case diary, it appears that informant Shyam Pandey and witness namely Prince Pandey, Subham Pandey and Piyush Pandey supported the case of the prosecution. Petitioners are named in F.I.R. As per injury report of informant, it transpires that Lacerated wound with (3 inch X 1/2 inch X 1/2 inch) found on the forehead with nose bleeding. However, injuries were found simple in nature but the allegation of assault with hard and blunt weapon on vital part of body is corroborated with the injury report.

7. Considering the above facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is not inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the accused petitioners, at this stage.

Hence, this anticipatory bail application is hereby **rejected**.
