1. This anticipatory bail application has been filed on behalf of above named accused petitioners who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Tekari P.S. Case No. 441 of 2025 for the offences punishable under Sections 190,191(2), 191(3), 126(2), 115(2), 117(2), 109, 74, 351(3), 303(2), 352 BNS.
2. Sh. Ajay Kumar Sinha, the learned advocate appeared on behalf of the accused petitioners. The prosecution is represented by the learned Additional Public Prosecutor.
3. The submission of the learned counsel of the accused petitioners is that there is no criminal antecedent against petitioners and a land dispute between both the parties is persisting. That compromise has been reached between both the parties as due to some misunderstanding on small scuffle the F.I.R. was registered. On these grounds a prayer has been made for grant of anticipatory bail to the accused petitioners.
4. The case of prosecution based on the written application of the informant, in brief is that, 19.10.2025 at about 8:00 PM, her cousin brother-in-law Kamlesh Kumar after parking her tractor at his door, was having in conversation with her. At the same time, Ajay Yadav came and began abusing Kamlesh Kumar. On which she objected and told him to go away as he was

in intoxicated state. Upon which, Ajay Yadav went home but after some time in conspiring of accused persons named in the F.I.R armed with club and iron rod came at her door and all of them started assaulting her family members brutally. Raju Yadav with intention to kill her husband assaulted him causing grievous head injury. Ajay Yadav, Gorakh Yadav, Parvindra Yadav and Bhola Yadav assaulted Kamlesh Kumar causing his left hand fractured. It is further alleged that when she raised alarm, Ramjay Yadav assaulted with iron rod. Ajay Yadav in drunken condition misbehaved with Sonali Kumari and snatched gold mangalsutra from informant's neck.

5. Heard the Ld. A.P.P. and the Ld. Counsel of defence and perused the case record. From perusal of the case record it transpires that, the allegation made is general and omnibus against the petitioners of assaulting. There is case and counter case as Tekari P.S. Case No. 442 of 2025. A compromise has already reached between both the parties and factum of compromise filed on record is admitted by prosecution party. Petitioner no. 3 and 6 carry one criminal antecedent vide Tekari P.S. Case No. 269 of 2021. Informant and the alleged injured appeared in Court and admitted that they lodged case on misconception. Vide injury report in para 39 and 42 of case diary, injury of injured persons were found simple in nature.

6. Considering the above facts and circumstances, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the accused petitioners. If the accused petitioners appear before the learned Original Court below within a period of one month from the date of receipt of the order to trial Court, they shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the original court with the statutory conditions particularized u/s 482 (2) of the B.N.S.S.

This anticipatory bail application is hereby **allowed**.
