1. This anticipatory bail application has been filed on behalf of above named accused petitioners, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Atri P.S. Case No. 75 of 2023 registered for the offences under Sections 341, 323, 308, 504, 34 of the I.P.C

2. Sri Pramod Kumar Gautam, the learned counsel has appeared to move this anticipatory bail prayer. The prosecution is represented by the Addl. Public Prosecutor.

3. The learned defence counsel has submitted that the accused petitioners are quite innocent, have committed no offence as alleged by the prosecution. There is no any specific allegation made against the petitioners and the injury sustained by the injured persons is found simple in nature. On these grounds a prayer has been made for grant of Anticipatory bail to the accused petitioners.

4. The case of prosecution based on written application of informant, in brief is that, on 18.02.2023 at about 9:00 AM, while he was going towards his village, accused persons named in the F.I.R. intercepted him and abused. On raising objection by him, accused persons assaulted him with rod, club, rod causing serious head injury.

5. Heard the Ld. A.P.P. and the Ld. Counsel of defence and perused the case record. From perusal of the case diary and injury report, it transpires that three injuries were found on the body of informant, however all the injuries were simple in nature. From perusal of the application submitted by the informant to S.H.O. Atri, it appears that, intention of the accused petitioners was only to cause assault and not to commit culpable homicide not amounting to murder. No criminal antecedent has been found

against the accused petitioners.

6. Considering the above facts and circumstances of the case, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the accused petitioners. If the accused petitioners appear before the learned original court within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of the order to the trial court, he shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial court with the statutory conditions particularized u/s 482 (2) of the B.N.S.S.

The prayer for anticipatory bail is hereby **allowed**.
