1. This anticipatory bail application has been filed on behalf of above named accused petitioners who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Gaya Mufassil P.S. Case No. 08 of 2026 registered for the offences under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 303(2), 125, 324(4), 351(2), 352, 117(2), 3(5) of the B.N.S.

2. Sri Dileep Kumar Pandey, the learned counsel has appeared to move this anticipatory bail prayer. The prosecution is represented by the Addl. Public Prosecutor.

3. The learned defence counsel has submitted that the accused petitioners are quite innocent, have committed no offence as alleged by the prosecution. There is no any specific allegation made against the petitioners. He also submitted that there is case and counter case. On these grounds a prayer has been made for grant of Anticipatory bail to the accused petitioners.

4. The case of prosecution based on written report of the informant in brief is that, on 27.12.2025 at about 08:00 PM, accused persons named in the F.I.R. invaded his house and started a dispute over drying a cloth in front of his house. Thereafter they started abusing and using filthy language. When informant objected they started assaulting his entire family. When his wife tried to intervene they assaulted her. His

daughter Monika Kumari, son Ritesh Kumar and Jeetu Kumar as well as his wife Geeta Devi were assaulted by all of the accused persons with clubs, bamboo rods and bricks. Accused Pramod Sharma assaulted informant and his wife with rod. Accused Hina Sharma assaulted his daughter and son with intention to kill them. They also damaged the glass of window of his house by pelting stones. It is further alleged that during assault they snatched Rs.10,000/- from his pocket. Thereafter they issued threat to kill the informant's family. Prior to this incident earlier these accused persons assaulted informant and his family causing his daughter Monika Kumari's hand fractured, his son's head swollen due to rod blows and his wife throat injured.

5. Heard the Ld. A.P.P. and the Ld. Counsel of defence and perused the case record. From perusal of the case record and F.I.R No.8 of 2026, it reflects that a free fight took place between the parties. There is general and omnibus allegation made against the petitioners of assault and snatching of Rs.10,000/-. There is also a counter case as Mufassil P.S. Case no.09/26. No criminal antecedent reported against the petitioners. Any incriminating material not found against the petitioners on record.

6. Considering the above facts and circumstances of the case, this court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the accused petitioners. If the accused petitioners appear before the learned original Court within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of the order to the trial court, they shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the trial court with the statutory conditions particularized u/s 482 (2) of the B.N.S.S.

The prayer for anticipatory bail is hereby **allowed**.
