1. This Regular bail application has been filed on behalf of above named accused petitioner who is in custody since 16.01.2026 in connection with Fatehpur P.S. Case No. 825 of 2024 registered for the offences under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 303(2), 308(3),308(4), 329(4), 111(2)(b), 111(3), 111(4), 112(1), 112(2), 351(2), 61(2), 3(5) of BNS.

2. Ms. Juhi, the learned counsel has appeared to move this Regular bail prayer. The prosecution is represented by the Ld. Addl. Public Prosecutor.

3. The learned defence counsel has submitted that the accused petitioner is quite innocent, has committed no offence as alleged by the prosecution. She further submitted that there is not any serious allegation against her petitioner because as per F.I.R. only scuffle took place between the parties. The only allegation against petitioner is of assaulting with the club. On these grounds a prayer has been made for grant of Regular bail to the accused petitioner.

4. On the other hand, learned A.P.P. opposed the bail by submitting that petitioner and other co-accused organised group of criminals and mafias who had caused this incident.

5. The case of prosecution based on the written application of the informant, in brief is that, on 24.12.2024, at about 12:00 noon, one Macy Fargusan Tractor without registration number forcibly started loading sand from the stock of his sand at Maharani Services, Dhadhar River Ghat No. 49, where the informant was working as Manager. On raising objection by one of his employee Suraj Kumar, they started

abusing and assaulting him. They issued threat with daring that they would load sand free of cost and if they would be stopped from loading, they would forcefully stop functioning of sand Ghat. They also assaulted the employee. It is further alleged that again at about 4:30 P.M., accused persons named in the F.I.R along with 12 unknown persons and 6 women invaded his office and assaulted Suraj Kumar with rod and club. They also demanded ransom money Rs.25,000/- per day for proper running of his sand Ghat. In the meanwhile, another member of this unlawful assembly namely Prince Kumar fired at informant's vehicle bearing registration no. BR-02BL-9191 with intention to terrorizing and causing life threatening injury to him.

6. Heard the Ld. A.P.P. and the Ld. Counsel of defence and perused the case record. From perusal of the case record it transpires that, the allegation made is found serious of not only attacking employers of the informant but also committing robbery of the sand from stock of the informant and also demanding extortion money. The allegations against the petitioner and other co-accused is very serious as by forming organised crime syndicate and use of violence, they have committed offence of robbery and extortion with use of fire arm hitting on vehicle of informant. One criminal antecedent is reported through para no. 22 of the case diary as P.S. No. 635/24, u/s. 109 B.N.S. etc.

7. Considering the above facts and circumstances of the case, more particularly gravity of allegation, this Court is not inclined to grant regular bail to the accused petitioner at this stage.

Accordingly, this regular bail application is hereby **rejected**.
