The present petition for anticipatory bail has been filed on behalf of petitioner Amit Kumar who is apprehending his arrest in connection with Complaint Case No.1701/2023 registered for the offences punishable u/ss 498(A) of the IPC.

Prosecution case, in brief, as per complaint case is that the marriage of complainant Puja Kumari was solemnized with Amit Kumar according to Hindu rites and customs on 29.04.2015. At the time of marriage, cash Rs.12,00,000/-, a bullet motorcycle, golden jewellery, television and other household articles worth Rs.3,00,000/- were given. After marriage, the complainant joined the matrimonial home where she lived fifteen days and then she returned to her Maikhe. It is further alleged that from the wedlock of the parties, on 14.05.2017, the complainant gave birth to a girl child and again on 28.09.2020 she gave birth to a boy child. It is further alleged that the accused/petitioner along with his family members started demanding Rs.11,00,000/- to purchase a Scorpio and upon denial by the complainant, the accused/petitioner and his family members started abusing and assaulting her and poured Kerosene oil on her body with an intention to cause death. Thereafter, she went to Mahila Police Station on 11.12.2020 where the matter was compromised. Again, on 20.10.2021, the complainant went her Sasural but the accused persons assaulted her and for the same an application was given at Tankuppa Police Station where the matter was compromised. Ultimately, the accused persons again assaulted her due to non-fulfillment of additional dowry and ousted the complainant along with her children from the matrimonial home. It is further alleged that accused/petitioner is doing job in SSB Sitamarhi and the complainant is getting Rs.12,000/- for the maintenance of herself and her children from the salary of accused/petitioner.

Ld. counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case. He further submits the allegation of demand of dowry

is totally false and baseless. He further submits that the petitioner is always ready to keep his wife along with children with full honour and dignity but his wife (complainant) is not interested to live with the petitioner.

The complainant along with her Id. counsel is present before this court who stated that the matter has been settled between them.

Perused the case record. Steps for conciliation between the parties was taken by this court and thereafter the matter was referred to the Secretary DLSA Gaya where both the parties have decided to live together and to expend Rs.12,000/- with consent of each other.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, the petitioner is directed to be released on bail in the event of arrest or surrender before the learned court concerned within a period of four weeks from the date of receipt of copy of this order on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 25,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court concerned.
