1. This regular bail application has been filed on behalf of above named accused petitioner who is in judicial custody since 24.03.2026 in connection with Belaganj P.S. Case No. 182 of 2026 registered for the offences under Sections 191(2),191(3),190,115(2),126(2),109(1),125,351(2) B.N.S.

2. The case of prosecution case is based upon written application filed by one Hrikant Kumar in which he has stated that on 23.03.2026 at 7:30 A.M. Kamlesh Yadav, Rajiv Kumar, Ranjan Yadav, Nitish Kumar, Nitin Kumar came to my door and started verbally abusing me. They claimed, why did you harvest the mustard crop? It is on our land, even though the land and crop are of complainant. When complainant asked them to stop the abuse, they began to assault him. When Prakash kumar intervened to protect Harikant Kumar they collectively attacked him with punches, kicks and stones. This resulted in a serious injury near his left temple, leading to bleeding and swelling. When villagers gathered at the scene, we retreated into our house. Subsequently, Kamlesh Yadav fired a pistol at the window, causing the glass to shatter as the bullet entered the house. The family narrowly escaped harm.

3. The Ld. Counsel for the defence stated that the petitioners have committed no offence and all the allegations levelled against the petitioner is false and fabricated based on conjecture surmises having no relationship with truth. The petitioner is ready to accept every direction your honour court. The petitioner is very poor but respectable person of their society and antecedent of the petitioner is clear and they have not involved in any case and custody since long. The matter of fact that petitioner Kamlesh Yadav has been lodged case against prosecution party vide Belaganj P.S. case no. 181/2026 which is only reason to lodge case against the petitioner to make pressure.

5. Ld. A.P.P opposed the prayer of the bail and stated that the accused petitioner has committed serious offence.

6. Heard and perused the case record. From perusal of the case record it appears that the allegation against the accused petitioner is that he along with other accused abused and assaulted the informant due to which he received injuries and there is specific allegation that he fired on the window and one empty cartridges was seized from the house. From the perusal of the case diary it is clear that there is land dispute between the parties and as per para 20 of the case diary (page-9) the nature of injuries is simple. The accused petitioner has two criminal antecedent. There is no recovery of arms. Case and counter case has been filed by both parties. The witnesses in para no9 and 10 of the case diary has stated that they have not seen anybody firing the gun shot rather stated they heard the sound of it.

7. Considering the omnibus allegation of assault, land dispute between the parties coupled with period of custody this court is inclined to grant regular bail to the accused petitioner. The accused petitioner be released from judicial custody of this case on furnishing bail bond of Rs 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount to the satisfaction of learned Jurisdiction Magistrate. Subject to the condition that:-

(i) One of the bailor must be close relative of the petitioner.

The prayer for regular bail is hereby **allowed**.
